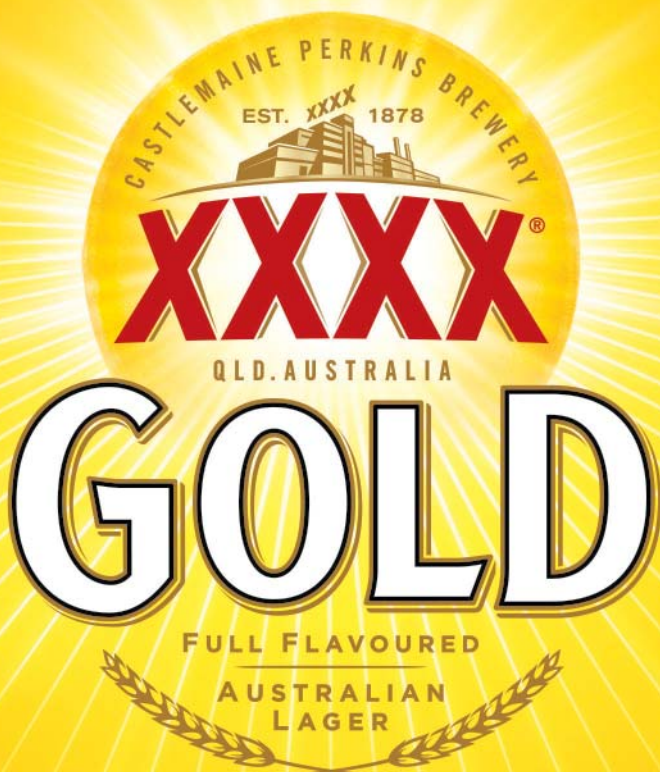

NEWPORT HOSTS AFL VICTORIA GIRLS CUP

With the rise in female football participation numbers evident across the country, the Newport Power Football Club has thrown its support behind female football, hosting the 2015 AFL Victoria Girls Cup last month.

Developed to give girls of all experience levels the opportunity to play in a competitive environment, over 130 girls from six schools strapped on the boots in a fun focussed day of footy.

Despite the rain and cold weather, nine teams from Altona Primary School, Altona North Primary School, Altona Green Primary School, Sacred Heart Primary School – Newport, Williamstown Primary School and St Marys Primary School – Altona headed to Bryan Martyn Oval to join in the festivities.

Hosted by AFL Victoria, with support from Newport Power FC, Western Bulldogs Football Club, Sunshine SEDA Group, Williamstown FC and Abel Sports, the day involved a 30-45 minute skills sessions at the beginning of the day, followed by a Round Robin competition.

The initiative saw girls in Grades 5 and 6 take part in the competition, with Grade 4 students encouraged to participate if teams were struggling for numbers.

After a successful day of fierce competition, it was Williamstown Primary School who were crowned the winners, after going undefeated for the day.

This year was just the cornerstone for the event, so judging by the success with the numbers that were involved, it looks as though this has taken a positive step forward for female football in the west.

In the WRFL alone, there has been a large increase in the participation of girls, with Caroline Springs/Manor Lakes Youth girls team signing up this season, as well as the recent Newport Power Youth Girls side who came was introduced halfway through the year.

Well done to all who took part in the event and made it such a success. Hopefully there will be more events across the state such as this, which has the potential to give the code a boost in the near future.

DIVISION TWO SENIOR GRAND FINAL REVIEW

Can a fairytale be clinical? There are no few adjectives and superlatives that can be used to describe Wyndhamvale's season – adventurous, audacious and dominant all fit the bill, but none as comfortably as 'clinical'.

Through the off-season the club retained its list, content with the quality already accrued, while other sides chased big name signings. During the regular season, the Falcons dismantled sides with a game built on defensive integrity while other teams tallied up big scores and ticking scoreboards. The finals were the performance of a seasoned favourite, doing more than enough to dispatch any challenge.

Such professionalism was reflected in the Falcon's final win over West Footscray. Three early goals against a strident breeze set the tone for Wyndhamvale and established a lead that would never be overtaken.

The first quarter harkened back to the club's clash two weeks prior – West Footscray were able to win their fair share of contested ball but a lack of skill with ball in hand and the defensive structures of the Falcons meant they received little reward. Wyndhamvale were able to counter attack with precision and only the inaccuracy of Paul O'Shea kept the Roosters as close as the 16-point quarter time margin.

Although the Roosters were lucky to be as close

as they were, their intensity lifted noticeably after quarter time. With their normal avenues to goal – Munir El Houli and Damien Yze well held, the underdogs manufactured the opportunistic goal kickers they had missed in the semi final. Adam Magnabasco scrapped his way to multiple goals while Denis Bicer – forced forward with a leg injury, kept the Roosters in the game with two majors.

West Footscray's willingness to fight and pressure had cut the Falcon's lead that had sat at 26-points halfway through the quarter, to just 13 at the final change. With the game on a razor's edge and emotions bubbling, Wyndhamvale's professionalism rose to the surface.

The Falcons smothered West Footscray around the ball early and gave Paul O'Shea the chance to compete one out – the spearhead finally finding his range and converting opportunities. With the wind sucked from the Rooster's sails Wyndhamvale piled on six-goals to begin the party early. Unheralded midfield bulldozer Noa Fonua was a worthy Rex Swann medal winner while Tyler Tessari was a rock across half back.

The perennial finalists have their first piece of senior silverware – a fairytale completed in the most clinical fashion.

DIVISION TWO RESERVES GRAND FINAL REVIEW

As the Division Two season came to an end last Sunday, fans of the Division Two Reserve competition were treated to an impressive Grand Final between West Footscray and Yarraville Seddon.

Only dropping one match the entire season, West Footscray lived up to their reputation of being a competitive side and was able to display some of their best football of the season.

Booting the first goal of the day, the Roosters got off to a confident start, harassing the ball at every contest while holding the Eagles to just one behind.

Despite leading by 13-points at the first break, the Roosters applied even more scoreboard pressure, piling on 3.5 to the Eagles' five behinds.

Still goalless going into the main break, Yarraville Seddon had an impressive second half, finding the big sticks in the third term and linking up better across the ground.

Yet despite a last quarter surge from the Eagles, the damage had already been done. West Footscray were simply too good and more consistent on the day. The final margin 10.14 (74) to 4.8 (32).

Rhys Kirk was a valued player for West Footscray kicking four goals, while teammates Karl Lewicki, Corey Thomas and Kane Lioxis combined for six.

West Footscray's Ben Douglas was awarded the best on ground medallion for his efforts on the day, while Matthew Nolton, Mohamed Abdou, Rhys Kirk, Patrick Trowsdale and Lee Allen all showed why West Footscray deserved the win.

In a disappointing day for the Eagles, Michael Volpi was a solid contributor, kicking three of this team's four majors, while Dean McDonald, Jason Camillo, Paul Azar, Jacob Connors, Aaron Disney and Andrew Willis were all stand out players.

They had been the two-standout teams all season, having lost just three-games combined all year.

Newport and Werribee Districts were both fitting Grand Finalists and it was going to be a huge match in a repeat of the 2014 Grand Final.

Last year the Tigers had prevailed to claim premiership glory; however it was the Power who entered the clash with the mental edge.

Despite finishing second on the ladder after trailing Werribee Districts for much of the year, Newport had claimed a vital semi-final win over Werribee Districts by 31-points. Throwing in the fact that their two-meetings were split in the home and away season, the game had all the makings of being a classic.

Having started slowly in their semi-final meeting, Newport weren't making the same mistake this time around, dominating the opening Grand Final quarter, even if they weren't fully rewarded for their efforts.

The Power kicked inaccurately but held the Tigers to just the one-goal to open a 17-point quarter time lead.

Having been completely outplayed in the first quarter, Werribee Districts bounced back quickly and wrestled back the momentum in the second term as they put in a dominant five-goal quarter, while also holding Newport to just two-behinds.

The domination saw the Tigers enter the main break with a 13-point lead, however the Power were close enough to setup a tense second half.

The premiership quarter was dominated by more inaccurate kicking from Newport, booting 3.6 to 2.1, which saw the Tigers enter the final term with a slender two-point advantage.

It was always going to be a tense finish and the Grand Final lived up to expectations with a frantic final term.

After three-quarters of inaccurate kicking, Newport held their nerve to boot 3.0 in the final term, while Werribee Districts could only manage 2.3 and on the final siren, the Power led by one-point and were crowned 2015 premiers. The final margin 9.13 (67) to 10.6 (66).

Chris Sotiropoulos was the key goalkicker for the winners with four majors, Mitchell Taleb added two and Lachlan Carpio was best on ground in a stellar display.

For Werribee Districts, even Timothy Mallia's five-goals weren't enough and despite the efforts of Scott Woods and Josh Snow, the Tigers fell agonisingly short of back-to-back premierships.

DIVISION THREE SENIORS GRAND FINAL REVIEW

The Albanvale Cobras are the 2015 Division Three Senior Premiers for the first time in its proud 37-year history after an emphatic 35-point victory over a credible Parkside.

The Cobras avenged both their four point defeat to Parkside a fortnight ago and their excruciating two point defeat to Braybrook in last season's premiership decider, those nightmares replaced with memories of jubilation and celebration for this year's minor premier.

Parkside have proven to be sensational front runners with their ability to comfortably dictate play and momentum. However, this time they were forced to take risks after the Cobras denied the Magpies the ball and their passing game.

Through John Sirianni and Jarryd Formosa, Albanvale raced out of the blocks to establish an early three goal lead before Magpie Benjamin Ashman pegged one back late in the term. The Cobras were vicious, bolting inside 50 on 19 occasions and launching 17 tackles to the Magpies' nine. Parkside would win the clearances before eventually settling into their style of game.

The second term was a classic reply from the 15-time senior premiers. The Cobras took ascendancy at the stoppages but Parkside increased their intensity in all other areas. Their marking game was vintage and forward Brent Kelly threatened to take the game away from Albanvale. Kelly kicked two goals and Stephen Campbell slotted one also.

When Clint Hunter kicked truly from a stoppage infringement, Parkside took a five point lead.

The third term isn't described as the premiership quarter for nothing. Albanvale's spread and attack was phenomenal. David Azzopardi rescued the lead early as the Cobras would pound on six goals to two. John Sirianni kicked goal number 100 for the season, Dallas Fedfern nailed a goal and small forward Jamie Diccico capped off his sensational finals series with one of the goals of the season. The Cobras led by 23-points.

The last quarter would also belong to the boys from Robert Bruce Reserve. Nathan Cuthbertson kicked a second and Matthew Harper booted his third and the contest was decided. Parkside continued to fight on; John Eastoe never giving up and Benjamin Ashman dominating possession. When the siren blew on a 35-point win, the celebrations began and continued well into the night.

Cobras ruckman Julian Story was awarded the Henry Turner medal for best afield for his domination of the tap battle. Sam Bonnici was incredible as were Shaun Blake and Mathew Plummer. Division Three Coach of the Year, John Thrush, was the centrepiece to his team's success and his squad will forever be the golden boys of Albanvale Football Club

DIVISION THREE RESERVES GRAND FINAL REVIEW

With the season coming to an end, one question remained in the heads of all Division Three Reserve fans. Would Albanvale, ladder leaders for majority of the season, be able to overcome the Wyndham Suns, the best team of late?

With the Suns on the verge of winning their first senior flag and looking to be heavily backed favourites, the premiership was theirs to lose. Yet they started their Grand Final match nervously, scoring two goals and five behinds in the first quarter, after dominating much of the play and holding Albanvale to just one goal.

Albanvale needed to respond in the second quarter, and while they kicked two goals of their own, the Suns scorched away to a blistering 32-point lead at half time, after kicking five goals for the term.

The Cobras again showed fight in the third quarter, however Wyndham, with the momentum behind them, kept pushing to ensure the premiership would be theirs. A four goal quarter had them heading into the final term with a 39-point lead, thanks to their improved accuracy over the previous two quarters.

In the final term, the Suns put on the afterburners with the knowledge that the premiership was theirs. Four goals sealed the deal, and while Albanvale

kicked a goal in the last term, the glory couldn't be taken away from the Wyndham Suns.

Leon Day was illustrious up forward for the premiers, kicking four goals for the afternoon, while Christopher Stephens was awarded the Best on Ground Medal for a superb display.

For Albanvale, Ange Messina kicked five goals, dominating up forward as he has for most of the year, taking his season tally to 92. James Glenn and Jason Karim were the best players for Albanvale, however they would take little away from the historic victory of the Wyndham Suns.

A premiership win in their first season is no easy feat, managing to defeat every other team, and leaving Albanvale, arguably the most dominant side all season, in the shade in four out of five clashes this year.

Next season, Wyndham will have to come back fit and firing if they are to win back-to-back flags, while the Cobras will be hungrier than ever to seek Grand Final glory in 2016.

However until that time, the Sun will continue to shine over Wyndham.

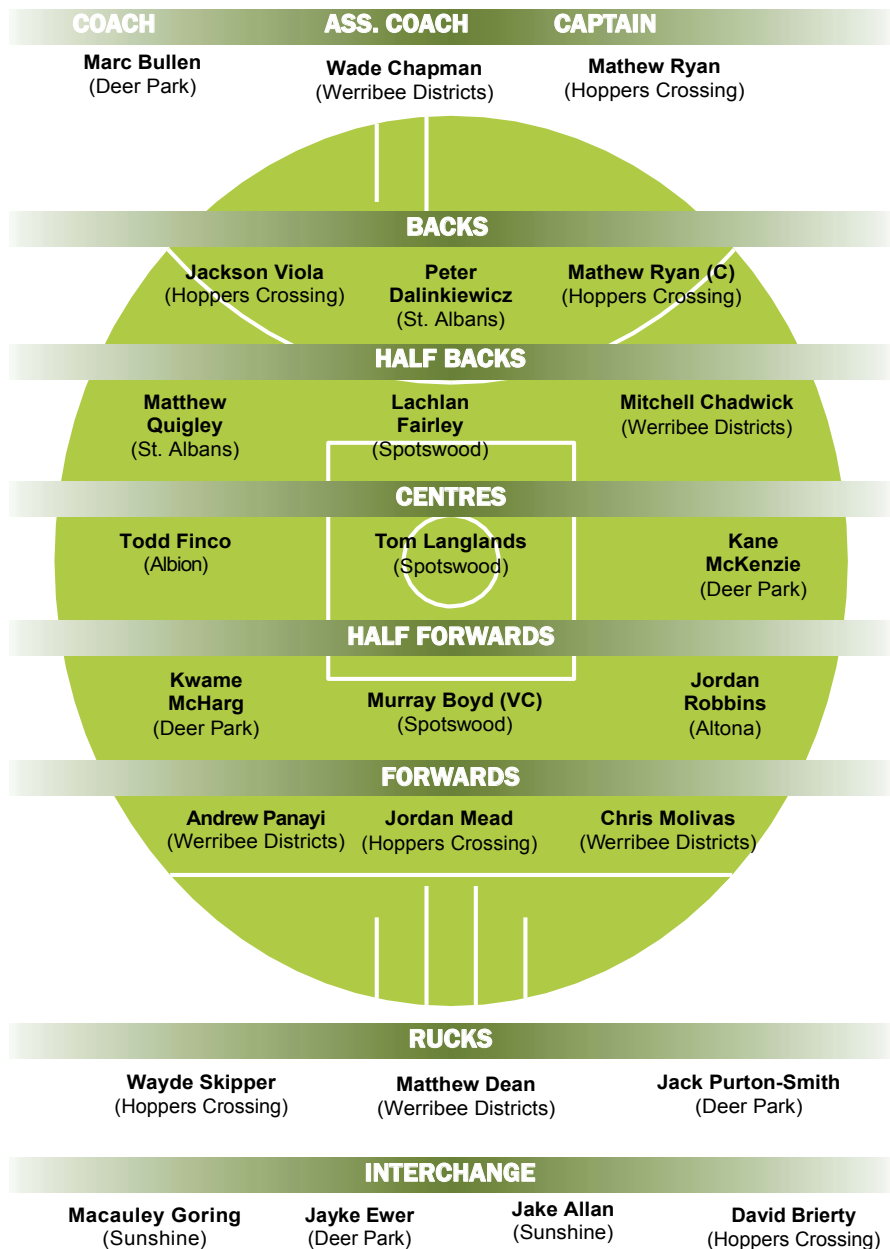

UMPIRES CORNER

For many in the WRFL, the season is already over, but of course, there are those players, officials, supporters and umpires that are still involved at the business end of the season. Even at this stage of the year, there are some who are already starting to plan for Season 2016.

With less games being played, the number of umpires still officiating at this time of the year has dramatically decreased and many whistles, whites and flags have been relegated to the back corner of the cupboard. There they will wait gathering dust until they are required in the first few months of the New Year. Even though many umpires may be inactive at present, the WRFL Umpires Association is still planning and organising for the future.

The WRFL and the Umpires Association have been instrumental in leading the way in developing umpiring academies in the west to recruit and train young umpires. The new field umpires generally start in Under 9 and Under 10 grades and are mentored by a handful of experienced umpires who are on the ground with them throughout the game.

In order to expand its mentor numbers, the association is looking for experienced people who are ex-umpires or current running umpires who are prepared to spend time early Sunday mornings in mentoring new young field umpires. Anyone interested in being involved is asked to please contact Terry O'Donnell on 0439-724-545.

This program is hoped to continue the large influx of junior umpires into the WRFL which has been happening in the last five or six years mainly due to the Werribee Academy at MacKillop Secondary College. Some of those former academy umpires will be seen this weekend blowing whistles and waving flags. Good luck to them as well as all umpires who have been selected to officiate in this weekend's finals.

LAWS OF THE GAME – QUIZ #22

Last week's question:

Player A is given a free kick on the boundary line and goes back beyond the boundary line to take his kick while his opponent (Player B) stands on the mark right on the white line. While still outside the boundary line Player A moves sideways, plays on at which point the field umpire calls, "Play on". He then attempts to run past Player B who has moved forward a metre when he heard the "Play on" call. Both players are wrapped up a legal tackle and fall over the boundary line back into the field of play. DIVISION ONE RESERVES REPORT

WHEN ONE PREMIERSHIP WAS NOT ENOUGH

By “Thomsie” and “Smackas”

As we prepare to witness premiership glory this afternoon, the WRFL's Steve Thom and Gary Turner wind back the clock to the 1970s to take a look at some of the most influential coaches the league has ever seen.

Whilst making it to the Grand Final is hard for most, the following eight men have reached the pinnacle on multiple occasions, leading their teams from the front and into the history books.

John Lloyd

(Braybrook) - 1973, 1974 and 1975.

Probably the first to introduce a form of discipline and professionalism to the Braybrook Football Club and the competition. Stopped the barrel on a Thursday night and taught his side how to get the best out of themselves on all occasions. John also set the scene for the future of coaching in metropolitan football.

Ron Brown

(North Footscray) - 1978, 1980 and 1983

Ron demanded and earned respect. He was as tough as nails as both a playing and non-playing coach. He wouldn't ask anything of his players that he wouldn't do himself. One of the first to introduce Sunday morning recovery which included a routine 6km run.

Robert “Bones” McGhie

(West Footscray- 1982, 2007 (Div 2) and St. Albans 1988 and 1989)

If he said jump, you'd ask how high! Bones was the master of bonding the playing group to work together as one. No-one would dare not look and listen when Bones spoke, and some of his match day tactics were innovative and ruthless.

Shane “Skitz” Keogh

(Albion- 1985, 1986 and Spotswood 1993, 1995)

Possibly coached decades too early. Keogh was the start of the new professional metro coaches. Left no stone unturned, to learn about opposition. Whether it was Albion or Spotswood premierships, Keogh made sure his team were ready and totally prepared for battle.

Larry Simmons

(Parkside 1996 and Hoppers Crossing 2002)

Larry was one of the great communicators and knew how to get the best out of individuals. He took the fitness levels of his players to a higher standard. He could be one of the boys, but knew exactly when to crack the whip and be an extremely respectful leader.

Phil O'Keefe

(Parkside) - 2000 and 2003

Did his work mainly during the week with one-on-one coaching. Hugely respected by his group, he knew what player's buttons to press to get his team success. Allowed players to believe in themselves and play on instinct.

Jason Clarke

(Port Melbourne Colts) 2005 and 2006

Clarke has a very smart football brain and is a great leader. He led the way for his players, both on and off the field. Sometimes controversial, yet very entertaining. He got the very best out of any player that represented the Port Colts Football Club.

Marc Bullen

(Deer Park) - 2013 and 2014

The modern day coach. Uncompromising in what he expects and what he pushes his players to achieve. Preparations and structures are a must, to be part of his team.

ESCAPE TO THE COUNTRY

Alan Pascoe is one of the most well-known and likable characters in the WRFL. He has also been a popular member of the umpiring fraternity for more than a decade. At age of 74, Alan took some time out from adjudicating in the WRFL to venture down to the Ballan Football Club where he developed a greater appreciation and understanding of country football. This is his story:

On the Saturday the 15th of August I ventured out of the leafy, sunny Metropolitan area of Melbourne and headed west to the goldfields region of Ballan. While I enjoy my time umpiring in the WRFL, I took the weekend off to complete a promise I made to my three grandsons that I would umpire a game at Ballan. The drive to Ballan was quite uneventful and I arrived in one piece. However, the weather had taken a turn and it was cold and raining. Just my luck!

Ballan play in the Central Highlands League and were playing Hepburn all day from the Under 12, Under 15, Under 18, reserves and seniors, with the first game starting at 8.30am. I decided to take a look at the ground and boy oh boy it was a muddy. Very much like the old St Kilda ground,

ankle deep in mud. The game started at 11.30am and the quarters were 20 minutes in duration. The standard of football was excellent with most of the boys having good skills in the wet. There was only one 50 metre penalty paid all day and no more than 15 ball ups and very few free kicks. The players had a lot of respect for each other and they were a complete joy to umpire. The crowd of about 700 were a joy to umpire in front of and it was a great match, particularly for Hepburn who kept their undefeated record intact.

So much so that when you went to change direction you were not sure if you would be standing up or be face down in the mud. After the game it was good to mingle with the other umpires and also hear some of their experiences.

It was a pleasure to help the Ballan Football Club out as they only get League umpires in the seniors while the rest are done by club umpires. If you ever get the chance to umpire in another league grab it with both hands.

2015 BARRY PRIEST MEDAL PREDICTIONS

Named after one of the WRFL's legendary players, the Barry Priest Medal is one of the league's most prestigious individual awards. Held in high esteem by all players, the award recognises the best and fairest player in the Division One senior competition throughout the home and away season. This year, we have seen many great standout players from various Division One clubs, many of who are sure to poll well. With such an even competition this season, this year's recipient is anyone's guess.

In anticipation of the 2015 Barry Priest Medal to be presented at the Senior Presentation Night on September 24, the WRFL Footy Record reviews a number of standout players from the top five teams we think are most likely to be in the mix to take home best and fairest honours.

DEER PARK:

Despite winning the past two flags, it seems the hunger for Lion's captain **Chris Stewart** is still as strong as ever. Named in the best on nine occasions this year, Stewart leads by example and has produced solid performances in his 17 matches. Teammates **Jack Purton-Smith** and **Kane McKenzie** are another two players who are likely to poll well, with both men named in the Team of the Year for their outstanding seasons.

HOPPERS CROSSING:

Warriors tall-man **Wayde Skipper** has been the source of many headaches for opposition coaches with his dominance in the centre circle unstoppable. Good below the knees and his versatility to play forward, Skipper's experience and ability to find the ball should see him poll well. Also in the mix are fellow Hoppers Crossing stars **Jackson Viola** and **Jordan Mead** who have all had excellent seasons and will no doubt rank highly in this year's count.

WERRIBEE DISTRICTS:

If you thought reigning Barry Priest Medalist **Matthew Dean** had a good 2014 season, think again. The hard running Tiger has been named in the best on 16 occasions from his 19 games and will once again be a strong contender for back-to-back wins. **Lachlan McDowell** has also had a standout year,

named in the best on 11 occasions, while the flashy **Chris Molivas** should also earn a few votes after a great season which saw him selected in the Team of the Year.

SPOTSWOOD:

Selected as the Team of the Year Vice-Captain, Spotswood captain **Murray Boyd** has had a season to remember. Named in his side's best players on a staggering 14 times, his flexibility to move forward saw him boot 39 goals. New recruit **Lachlan Fairley**'s year has been one to savour with his position as a key swing player earning him a place in the top echelon of players on 13 occasions.
