LAST week, reigning premiers Deer Park showed the rest of the competition that they are still the team to beat in Division 1 after dismantling ladder-leaders Hoppers Crossing by 70-points.

Whatever way you look at it, the remaining seven games are going to make for some fascinating viewing.

The evenness isn't just limited to Division 1, the Division 2 and 3 competitions are also just as tight.

In Division 2, North Footscray are touted as premiership fancies, but you can't underestimate the Yarraville Seddon Eagles and Caroline Springs, who also have the talent to win the flag.

In Division 3, Newport Power and Parkside are the top two sides duelling for the premiership.

The two clubs will go head-to-head today, in what should be a fantastic match.

Also, congratulations to Laverton who scored its first win of 2016 at the weekend. There win now means each senior team across all divisions have won at least one game.

BROOKER MAKES SWITCH FROM RUGBY TO AFL

GROWING up in Namibia, Michael Brooker never thought that one day he would be playing Australia's favourite sport.

The 28-year-old was born and bred in the South African country, but after deciding to travel to Australia as a teen and ultimately decide to settle in Melbourne, the home of AFL.

After a few years of playing rugby he chose to have a crack at the local sport and after just a couple of months Brooker finds himself playing football at the West Footscray Football Club.

"I have been in Victoria for the past six or seven years, I spent the three years before that travelling around, so all in all it has been about 10 years in Australia," Brooker said

"I played rugby most of my life, being from South Africa it is pretty common to play rugby.

"I was getting a bit tired of rugby, I am not old, but I am not young and I am not chasing that dream of being a professional anymore, so I thought I would try a different sport.

"I have been living in Victoria for a long time and I have got my citizenship, so I thought why not try the local sport. It would be a bit of sin if I didn't try it."

Brooker, whose family also now call Melbourne home, was training with Western Region Football League club Altona, but due to the high number of players already on the Vikings' list, he wasn't guaranteed a spot.

He said Altona coach Saade Ghazi pointed him in the direction of West Footscray, a club who at the time was struggling to field a senior and reserves side and needed players.

Brooker said he is still adjusting to the nature of the sport, but since joining the Roosters he says he has learnt a lot.

Before making the move to Australia he hadn't seen a game of AFL.

"When I first saw a game I thought it was a very interesting sport," Brooker said.

"There was obviously a lot of running, I thought it was very chaotic.

"In rugby if you drop the ball it is a bad thing, but here it is sort of part of the play.

"AFL is definitely more dimensional, it isn't head on, so there is less structure but there is still tactics, that is what I first thought when I saw the game and that's what it feels like when I play the game."

Since joining West Footscray he has played in four games across both seniors and reserves.

Brooker said because he is still getting the hang of the game, coach Shane Lucas has been experimenting with where his best position is.

"I am aggressive on the ball, but I am not necessarily a great jumper," he said.

"I have also played at centre half forward, mostly for the contest and not necessarily the mark, once the ball hits the ground I can attack the footy."

Brooker was a part of West Footscray's first win of the season in Round 10, when it defeated Manor Lakes by 37-points at Shorten Reserve.

"It was great (to win)," he said.

"It is good to be a part of the team that is winning, we played really well and I was able to score my first goal.

"It is always a good feeling to win regardless of the sport."

Chris celebrated his 300th game in Round 10 when the Devils demolished Albanvale, while Ashleigh will play in his 300th today, when North Footscray take on Manor Lakes at Hansen Reserve.

Ashleigh, who has played footy with the Yarraville Seddon Eagles, Glen Orden and North Footscray said he hadn't realised the milestone was so close.

He said he took three years off footy because he lost interest in the game, but his desire to play with mates is what drew him back to football and to North Footscray.

"I missed playing with footy with my good friends so I wanted to come back and play," Ashleigh said.

The 28-year-old said his career highlights so far, were winning an Under-18 premiership in 2005 as well as

winning the 2008 Division 2 Reserves flag.

For Chris on the other hand, a premiership has eluded him.

"I stated playing at North Footscray in the Under-16s and I played in a grand final my first year, but we ended up losing," he said.

"I haven't played in any grand finals since."

Chris hoped his fortunes would change this year.

The Devils are currently in the top three and a certainty to play finals footy at the end of the season.

"We have played finals and been knocked out first round both times, so we are hoping to go further this year," Chris said.

Chris said he really enjoyed playing footy with North Footscray, saying it was great club to be involved with.

"I have been there for about 10 years and everyone has been really friendly, from my teammates to the older guys behind the bar," he said.

"It really is a family club."

Keith's wife Kim said Rebecca, a 36-year-old mother of three, had been diagnosed with cancer only a few months ago.

"Rebecca is a very active young mother who was playing netball weekly and just got up and showering one day found a small lump, this little lump turned out to be an aggressive cancer that for the last few months has totally changed their lives," she said.

"She has undergone chemotherapy, and operations to remove lump.

"Rebecca faces a major operation this week and will

Football clubs have always been great places to get support from others and Kim says that has been the case for Rebecca.

"She is going through a terrible part of her treatment now." she said.

"We are all here for her and will be long into the future.

"One of our girls' team members lost their mother earlier this year and I believe the girls have been a great support to her.

"As a family we all support each other."

Kim said a big part of holding a pink themed round was because Rebecca wanted to raise awareness of breast cancer in our community.

"Rebecca just wants everyone to become aware of breast cancer and for people to their monthly checks and if you have any doubt to go to the doctor immediately," she said.

"We want to find a cure for this terrible disease."

WARRIORS CONTINUE MARCH TO FINALS

THE gap between the top four and the chasing pack is starting to get beyond reach as Sunshine won its seventh game of the season, to extend its lead over fifth-placed Deer Park by two games.

The Kangaroos comfortably defeated Albion at the weekend, downing the Cats 14.9. (93) to 5.5. (35).

Three goals to Cory Connor, and two each to Nicholas Triplett, Bradley Busuttil, Trent Waring and Mark Williams sealed the 58-point victory.

Albion is still in contention for the finals, but will need its form to improve in order to prevent St. Albans from jumping ahead of them on the ladder.

The Roos will next face fellow top-four side Werribee Districts, with the Cats set to battle Deer Park.

Hoppers Crossing continued its march towards the finals after earning its ninth win, when they defeated Deer Park at Hogans Road Reserve.

The first half was close as the Warriors led by just 10-points at the half, despite having 12 scoring shots to seven and keeping the visitors scoreless in the first quarter.

The second half showed why the Warriors are premiership favourites as the side came out after half-time and booted nine goals to one.

The home side had nine individual goal kickers, showing the competition that Hoppers are not reliant on just one or two forwards to kick a winning score.

The loss means Deer Park slip to five wins and five losses

and fifth on the ladder. However the Lions are still in the finals race.

Its two game lead over Albion should be enough for the Lions to comfortably earn a spot in the 2016 finals series.

In Round 12, Hoppers Crossing will take on Spotswood.

Spotswood couldn't have had better preparation for that matchup as it came from behind to defeat St. Albans 11.4. (70) to 8.9. (57).

The game was close throughout, as the Saints held the lead for most of the match.

Heading into the final term, Spotswood were down by 17-points, but five goals to zero helped the home side erase the deficit to score a memorable 13-point win.

St. Albans will look to get its disappointing season back on track against Altona.

Werribee Districts demolished Wyndhamvale by 112-points, the round's largest victory.

The game was over after the first half, as the Districts led 65 to one.

The Falcons took a step back as they were unable to kick a goal over the four quarters, leading to the 16.19. (115) to 0.3. (3) win for the home side.

The big win sees the Districts jump into second place.

UMPIRES CORNER

BOUNDARY UMPIRE MARKS SIGNIFICANT MILESTONE

RECENTLY the prolific AFL boundary umpire in Darren Wilson retired after officiating in over 400 AFL games. This included an astonishing 12 consecutive AFL grand finals.

Darren is only one of a handful of umpires to have umpired over the magical 400 game mark at the top level, however he is the first boundary umpire to reach that total

Just a few weeks prior to that another umpire achieved a remarkable milestone.

AFL goal umpire, David Dixon, become the record holder for the most VFL/AFL games as a goal umpire with 338 games.

In 1987 when David finished playing junior football he was invited by the Footscray District Football League (now the WRFL) to take up umpiring.

He umpired for seven years on our local grounds as a boundary umpire officiating in several open age grand finals before switching to waving flags.

A couple of years later he was invited into 'town' and the rest is history.

David's advice for up and coming umpires was to work hard and you will reap the awards.

"You can't just maintain to your level. You have to continuously improve and reinvent yourself, just as players and coaches do, to ensure that you are at your best once you walk onto the field," he said.

Not everyone who takes up umpiring is fortunate to be able to officiate for such lengthy periods of time.

At Scovell Reserve the WRFL umpires have a small honour board listing those who have umpired for 30 years or more.

Out of the thousands who have blown whistles, run boundaries or waved flags, the list is indeed short.

It is interesting to ponder whether any of our present running umpires will still be involved in 30 years' time.

Umpires are tending to start much younger now than in previous decades. Maybe that small honour board will need extending?

Finally, a reminder that the umpires' association is organising a Farewell (to Scovell Reserve) Reunion



of past and present members on Saturday August 6 at 7 pm at Scovell Reserve.

Life members and Gold members are free while all others can attend for \$10 which includes finger food.




