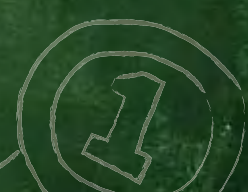

MEREDITH'S MISSION AS ACTING LEAGUE PRESIDENT

THE Angwin name as long been synonymous with the Western Region Football League.

Ron and Thelma Angwin were both involved in the then Footscray District Football League as president and treasurer and now their daughter Meredith, has followed in their footsteps and is now the acting president of the league.

The Angwin family, who has lived in the west for generations, has always loved football and has always been passionate about the Western Bulldogs.

"I was born and bred in Footscray, I grew up here, so we do bleed red, white and blue," Meredith said.

Ron, who has since passed away, was president of the FDFL for 11 years between 1981 and 1991, so Meredith grew up learning a lot about the goings on of the league.

Fast forward to 2016 and Meredith has now holds the role of acting president.

She took the reins as chair after Bruce Mildenhall and his wife decided to take an extended stay in Greece.

Meredith first joined the board in 2014 after CEO Bob Tregear invited her to join the league.

"My father was involved in the FDFL and my mother as well, so when I was invited to come onto the board I jumped at the chance," Meredith said.

"I love football and I am passionate about giving back to the community."

As well as giving back to her community, Meredith has also forged a successful career in IT Consulting, a profession that saw her live and work overseas.

"I have worked overseas from 2004, I worked extensively in Japan, lived and worked in Shanghai, China, spent time working in Singapore and all over Asiana and finally lived and worked in Bangkok, before I came back to Australia," she said.

Through her senior management roles, Meredith has taken a keen and active role in all aspects of the board's business since she first joined the WRFL.

"Since joining the board, we have focussed on getting a clear strategic plan and direction for the league," Meredith said.

"We have been focusing on and ensuring we keep the strong history and traditions of the league going, but also recognising we have to take on change as we continue to move forward.

"There is still a lot of challenges.

"The world is facing a lot of change, no more so than in community sport, whether it be football or cricket or another sport, there is a lot of change happening and we are continuing to face those challenges."

Meredith said she was proud to be associated with the WRFL and since holding the role as acting president, her involvement with the league has continued to grow.

Moving forward, Meredith said her goals were to continue to run a successful football competition, while also making some improvements in and around the league.

"We have two areas we are working on, firstly is building on our Respectful Cultures of the West initiative," she said.

"We are particularly focussed on increasing female participation at all levels, whether that is having more women on the board, in an administration roles, as trainers, umpires and obviously having a standalone competition for girls and young women in the future.

"The other thing I would like to focus on is actually getting more collaboration and understanding of what is happening outside of our league."

Meredith said she would also continue to get the best out of the board.

"We have some really talented people involved, so I want to try and get the best out of everyone on the board."

WILLEM MAKES A MEMORABLE DEBUT

WILLEM Barber is the Flemington Junior Football Club's newest recruit.

The energetic eight-year-old has recently joined the Colts' Under-9 team and despite his late start to the season, the youngster has had an immediate impact on his new team.

Willem father's connection with AFL as a player and an umpire, combined with his older brother Fynley's involvement with Flemington Juniors, meant he has grown up in and around footy.

However, what makes Willem's story different than most juniors wanting to play footy, is that he was born with Down Syndrome.

A genetic condition that affects his 21st chromosome. This causes developmental delay and a range of other health conditions.

Willem has also had hearing issues and from a young age has worn a hearing aid.

He attended Furlong Park School for the Deaf for three years. The bilingual school is where he learnt sign language, which he still uses regularly.

Willem now attends Holy Rosary Primary School and after some encouragement from his family, friends and Flemington Juniors coach Rob Green, the youngster decided it was time to pull on the boots and play.

"It has meant a lot that the dads from our local

community have welcomed, supported and encouraged Willem to join the team," Willem's mother Abi said.

"The most valuable thing you can offer a child with a disability is the genuine opportunity to be included and participate with their friends and peers.

"When I see this happen I know Willem will be ok in this world even if I'm not by his side his whole life."

Willem's skills and knowledge of the rules are not what you'd expect from a typical footy loving eight-year-old, but that doesn't mean his enthusiasm and willingness to be involved is any less than his team mates.

Over the last few weeks of the season his confidence and his passion for kicking the footy around with his new friends continued to grow.

"He's pretty aware he's not as skilled as others and that might also be a big challenge for him to overcome, but whatever happens with his football career his family will always remember the parents and kids that welcomed him into the club and encouraged him to play footy," Abi said.

THE reigning premiers Deer Park will be putting their feet up this week before gearing up for a big two week season finale, then another finals campaign.

The Falcons went perilously close last week and from all reports probably should have won. I think that might have been their last gasp for 2016.



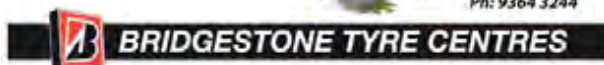

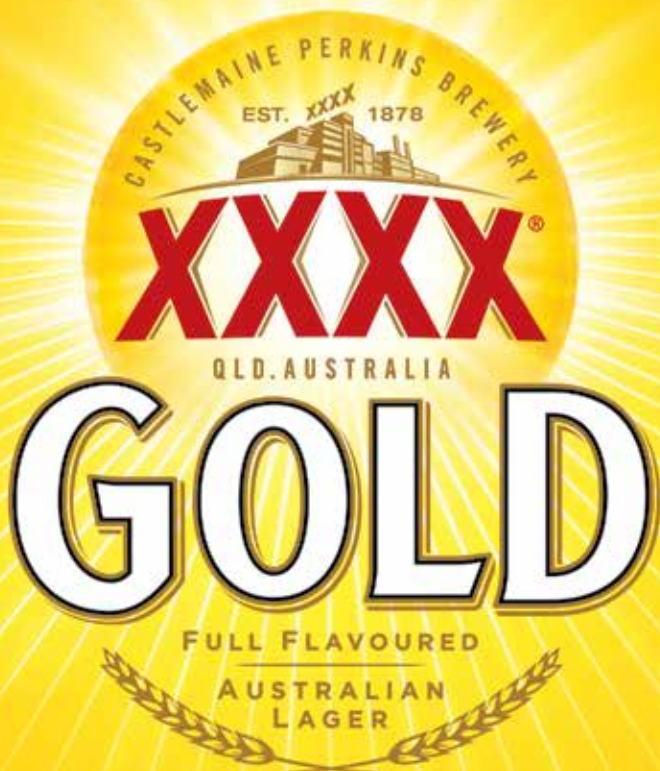
