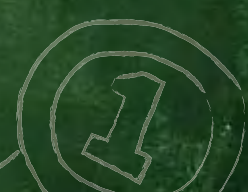

LANGLANDS HONoured WITH SEN MVP AWARD

SPOTSWOOD star Tom Langlands has been awarded as the Western Region Football League's Most Valuable Player for 2016.

Voted on by all Division 1 coaches, Langlands polled 18 votes, two ahead of St Albans champion Tim Jenkins and Albion ruckman Troy Kelm, who each received 16 votes.

Altona captain Jordan Robins came in fourth place with 12 votes, while Wyndhamvale's Brian Graham, in his first season with the Falcons, was fifth with 10 votes.

Now in its sixth year the SEN Most Valuable Player Award recognises the WRFL's best overall senior player in the Division 1 competition.

Using the 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 system, coaches voted for the players that were not necessarily the 'best player' but one who embodies leadership, versatility, ability to play under pressure, skill and courage, respect for all umpires and overall value to their team.

Langlands had a fantastic year. Of the 16 home and away season games played, he was named in the best on 13 occasions.

The talented midfielder was also involved in the WRFL's Interleague campaign, representing the league in the Community Championships match against Ballarat earlier this year.

Langlands said he was honoured to have won the MVP award.

"It is special," he said.

"I have been playing for so many years in the Western Region Football League and have been back at Spotswood for the past six years, so I am pretty stoked to be recognised as one of the better players of the league."

Langlands said the reason for his standout season was consistency.

"I have been lucky this year," he said.

"I have taken care of my body and haven't had any injuries.

"I have played every game this season and that helps to maintain some consistency, it also helps the team as we do have a young side.

"As a leader and a coach, it is important for me to give a 100 per cent each week."

Spotswood's 2016 finals campaign ended at the weekend, with Altona defeating the Woodsman on Sunday at Burbank Oval.

As part of Langlands' award, he will be invited to the Division 1 Grand Final Luncheon on Sunday, September 11. There he will receive his MVP award.

FOUNDATION GEARS UP FOR LEGENDS MATCH

THE EJ Whitten Foundation is gearing up for its annual Legend's Match, with a host of former premiership stars, Brownlow medallists and fan favourites lacing up the boots once again.

The game will see rivals Victoria take on the All-Stars on September 2 at Etihad Stadium, with a big crowd expected to enjoy the thrills and spills of some of the games greats.

The blockbuster match will be played live across the country on Channel 7, Foxtel and Telstra, the host broadcaster of the AFL premiership season.

Radio stations Triple M, 3AW and Croc Media will also cover the game.

Werribee Districts coach Paul Chapman and Newport Power playing coach Mark Williams have both been named in the initial Victorian and All-Stars squads.

The pair will be joined by Western Bulldogs favourite sons Tony Liberatore, Brad Johnson and Scott West.

Currently the Victorian team leads the win-loss ratio 10 to nine, with one draw played out.

While the game will be a fantastic footy spectacle, the match isn't just about the stars of yesterday putting on a show, it is also about raising funds and awareness of Men's Health and Prostate Cancer.

EJ Whitten Foundation's executive director Ted Whitten Jr said the foundation was formed in 1955 in memory of his larger than life father Ted Whitten Snr.

He said the foundation is a leading player in the promotion of Men's Health and Prostate Cancer awareness.

"Most men are traditionally reluctant to go to the doctor and need to be reminded regularly that early detection and diagnosis particularly with Prostate Cancer is the way to stay on top of any untimely illness that may occur," Whitten said.

"We hope to make the Trading Post.com E.J. Whitten Legends Game bigger and better than ever and potentially save many lives along the way."

Whitten Jr said the Legends Match wasn't the only way the community could get involved with foundation.

He said the 'Time to Test' initiative was another way local footy clubs could get the word out.

"The Time to Test Awareness program is aimed at men who are approaching 50 years of age and is designed to remind them that they need to commence an annual health and Prostate check-up not just for Prostate Cancer but for all the other things that can go wrong in a man's life as he is getting older," Whitten said.

"WRFL Clubs can get involved in the program by promoting the message to their players and by displaying the Time to Test posters in their clubrooms."

THE Yarraville Seddon Eagles survived a late surge from North Footscray to hold on for a 6-point win over the Red Devils on Saturday.

For the victors, Corey Thomas kicked five goals and Cajetan Faranda booted two.

Newport were kept in the contest by Khalad Houli's four majors and Tohi Gold Okati's tremendous pressure at the coalface.

It was a team that had nothing to lose, having finished two games off top spot, and a level below the other two finals competitors. However, in finals your ladder position doesn't matter, and if the Suns keep up their current form, anything could happen.

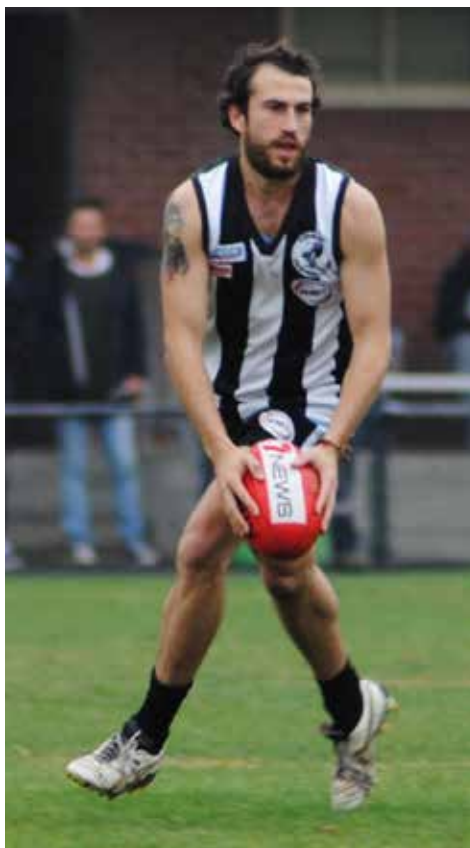
Moving to preliminary finals weekend and Wyndham and Parkside will face off to determine who gets a

DON'T JUDGE A BOOK BY ITS COVER

YOU can't judge a book by its cover is certainly an old expression and it often rings true.

John Huntington, general manager of the Footscray District Football League from 1974 to 1984, was a big powerfully built man but even so was said to be lightning quick on the badminton court.

Former FDFL field umpire in Michael Sexton was told by one umpiring official that he was too fat to be any good.

A year or two later he umpired the FDFL's 1990 A2 Grand Final when Port Colts kicked 16-18 to Hoppers Crossing's 12-10.

To add further salt into the wound, Michael actually umpired 6 games in 1997 in the AFL in his one and only season at that level.

Another old adage is that no matter what you're doing then you've got to look the part.

Often it has been said that if you are an umpire then at least you should look like an umpire.

The two field umpires who recently took the field in a local Masters' game were a sight to behold.

One had black shorts, long orange socks, no sweat bands and a cap. The other one had white shorts, white ankle length socks, two sweat bands and no cap.

Both did have an orange shirt but one had the sponsor's logo on the back with a similar motif on the front. The other's shirt had no logo on the back but had an association's name on the front. At least both had whistles.

Hopefully the WRFL umpires at the senior finals that you are watching today, field, boundary and goal, are correctly attired.

Take a moment and see if you can spot any subtle differences in their uniforms. They do exist because occasionally when new orders of uniforms are made they are not always exactly the same as any previous orders.

Regardless of any differences in uniform it is hoped that the umpires perform to the standard required and expected in finals.

Mark Westgarth, in his address to the umpiring fraternity on the eve of the senior finals, stressed the importance of composure, communication and control.

He also emphasised the need for teamwork. Hopefully in amongst the great football the umpires will be exhibiting composure, communication, control and teamwork.

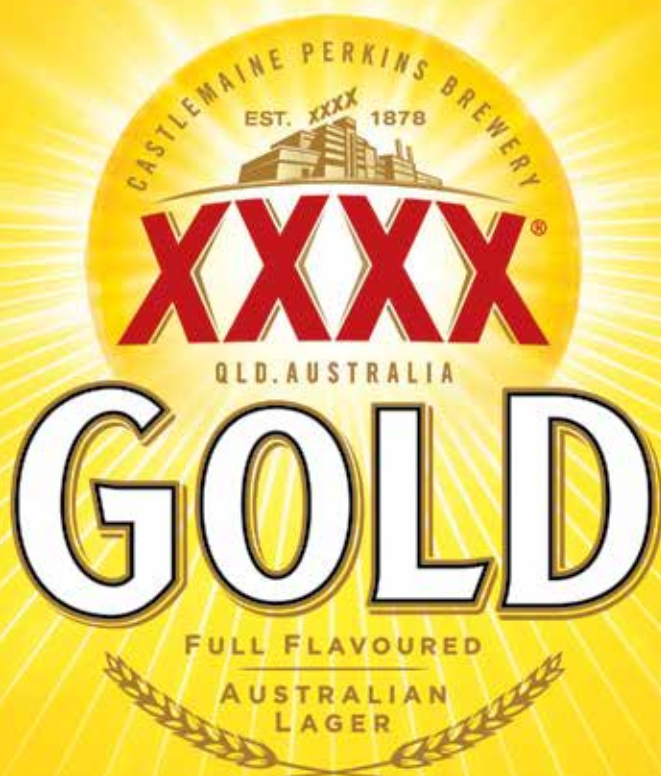
