President

At the end of the 2011 season, I am pleased to report that the Western Region Football League is in sound shape and well placed to meet the challenges and opportunities ahead. In just two short years, the League has established a sound administrative and financial base; and has a clear vision for its future direction, as detailed in the Strategic Plan.

Our 2010 Strategic Plan identified six key issues agreed by member clubs as the most important drivers of planning for the future, ie:

- Home of WRFL – accessibility, storage, cost, exposure and degree of independence.
- Reputation and image – how the WRFL and its member clubs are perceived in the Community.
- Umpire recruitment – retention, education and support.
- Retention and growth – junior and senior club/player numbers.
- Club Development – a strong push for WRFL to invest in club development through the employment of a club development officer and via the new CEO role.
- Evenness of Competition – for both juniors and seniors.

The Executive Board and staff team have addressed all of those six key issues, and many of the key deliverables of the Strategic Plan have already been met.

The move to our new home at Whitten Oval has proven a resounding success. The new office arrangements provide attractive and efficient working facilities for staff. The location in the “football hub” of the west identifies the WRFL and its clubs as important players in the rapidly growing football industry. Consistent with the Strategic Plan, the previously unbudgeted rental costs incurred in the move to Whitten Oval have been covered by interest earned through careful management of cash flow, without any call on member clubs for additional fees.

The League’s reputation and image have taken a major step forward with return of the weekly Footy Record during the football season; and redesign of the website www.wrfl.org.au. These important communication channels have supported more than 50% increase in financial return from corporate sponsorship over the past year, with a further increase of similar magnitude forecast in the coming year. They have also provided for enhanced communication both within the League and to the wider community.

As part of our community engagement strategy, the WRFL established an ongoing partnership with the EJ Whitten Foundation early this year. \$2,000 was raised for the Foundation in association with our senior Grand Final luncheon functions. In future years, that League and its clubs will assist the Foundation in its important work of raising funds for prostate cancer research and awareness.

After two highly successful years of umpire recruitment, we are well on the way to meeting the Strategic Plan target of 300 official WRFL umpires by 2014. From a precarious position at the start of the 2010 season when umpire numbers had declined to just 126, we finished the 2011 season with 255 active umpires. This is a great credit to the work of Terry O’Donnell and his recruiting committee; and to the many support personnel who have worked so hard to establish and run the three umpiring academies.

Our single greatest challenge and opportunity is to manage the growth and development of the game in the fastest-growing population base of Australia. The appointment of Tim Shellcot as Club Development Officer demonstrates the Board’s commitment both to support of existing clubs and to development of new clubs in the growth areas. Discussions are well advanced with

Wyndham City Council and local volunteer groups to establish new junior clubs, perhaps as early as next year. We are pleased to welcome PEGS Juniors (Old Essendon Grammarians Football Club) to our junior program from 2012.

The success already recorded in meeting Strategic Plan objectives, particularly through increased sponsorship support, will flow through to lower costs to all WRFL clubs from 2012 onwards. The Board has adopted a balanced operating budget for the 2011-12 financial year that includes a 10% reduction in affiliation fees, as well as significant reductions in insurance charges. Our aim will be to continue to pass on cost savings to clubs as we broaden the base of revenue from non-club sources.

The challenge of competition evenness at both senior and junior levels remains as the only key issue from the Strategic Plan that has not been substantially addressed. A working group of senior club Presidents will be formed shortly to develop and recommend options for our senior competitions. The Juniors Board will work with club officials and League staff to identify the optimum structures and regulations for the 2012 junior season.

Strategic planning is an ongoing process, requiring constant monitoring and review. Given the outstanding success already recorded through the 2010 Strategic Plan, it will be necessary to undertake a major review and planning exercise in consultation with member clubs during the 2012 season. I encourage all clubs to participate that review and to contribute to the future success of the League.

At the 2010 Annual General Meeting, I was re-elected as President for a further 3-year term, as were fellow directors Barry Lovell and Gina Smith. The only nominations for Board positions received this year were from the retiring members John O’Callaghan (Vice President), Bruce Mildenhall and Janine Mizzi, all of whom will be declared as elected unopposed at the Annual General Meeting on 30th November. I extend congratulations to the re-elected Board members and my personal thanks to all members of the Board who have given so freely of their time and expertise to oversee the governance of the League during the past two years.

Thank you to all of the members of the Juniors Board, Independent Tribunal, Independent Hearing Committee, Appeals Board and Rules Review Sub-Committee whose voluntary efforts have been invaluable to the operation of the League during the year under review.

Thanks also to CEO Bob Tregear and our dedicated staff team who have worked hard to manage the day-to-day affairs of the League and to deliver the targets set out in the Strategic Plan.

Chief Executive Officer

Season 2011 was a year of consolidation, continued planning and achievement. Foundations laid through the 2010 strategic planning process provided structure and direction for completion of many of the key deliverables of the League's Strategic Plan. Immediate benefits included increased coverage of both senior and junior matches with official umpires; a major improvement in the League's public profile through an exciting new website design, weekly Footy Record and continued support from local press; a significant increase in corporate sponsorship support; a solid financial operating result; and the most successful finals series in recent history.

By the time it was formally adopted in September 2010, significant progress had already been made towards the Strategic Plan's deliverables. The League's headquarters had already been relocated to Whitten Oval. The foundations had been laid for a strong and lasting partnership with the Western Bulldogs. Umpire numbers were rapidly increasing. Ongoing communications had been established with all five of our core local Councils.

The appointment in October 2010 of the WRFL Juniors Board under the chairmanship of Keith Brown, President of Newport Power FC has provided much needed focus of concentration on our junior programs and competitions. We fielded 175 teams in WRFL junior competitions in 2011, ranging from under 9s to under 16s. For the first time, competitions were conducted in single-year intervals across eight age groups. Despite some initial teething problems resulting from late team changes and withdrawals, the junior season was an outstanding success, with fourteen competitive divisions (Under 11 to Under 16) and six non-competitive divisions (Under 9 and Under 10). Our thanks to all members of the Juniors Board for their efforts this year.

The outstanding gains in umpire numbers achieved in 2010 were continued in 2011. Under the driving force of Umpires' Association Secretary Terry O'Donnell, the umpire recruiting effort was continued through three academies at Werribee, Maribyrnong and Caroline Springs. More than 250 umpires officiated in WRFL senior and junior games this year, more than double the number of those registered at the beginning of the 2010 season. Recruiting and retention will be a key focus as we aim for the Strategic Plan deliverable of 300 umpires by 2014.

The Strategic Plan aim to reduce costs to clubs over the next three years was initiated in the 2010-11 budget with freezing of affiliation fees. That strategy will be continued in 2011-12 with a 10% reduction in affiliation fees, as well as significant reductions in insurance charges.

The reduction in affiliation fees charged to clubs has been made possible through budget strategies to increase revenues from non-club

sources. Consistent with the Strategic Plan, major increases in net finals and sponsorship incomes have provided the means to secure an appropriate level of staffing, with the capacity to service existing and develop new revenue streams.

Arguably the most important strategic initiative of recent years was initiated in July 2011 with the support of member clubs to initiate a "top-to-bottom" review of WRFL constitutional and governance arrangements. A Rules Review Sub-Committee chaired by Executive Board member Mick Psaila has commenced that work and will present an interim report to members early in 2012. The review will be completed during 2012, culminating in revised Statement of Rules and By-Laws.

Central to the achievements of the past year was the small but committed staff team whose application, dedication and "love of the job" should be recognised.

Tim Shellcot commenced duties as Football Operations and Club Development Officer in March, replacing Phil Lovell who took-up a senior sports planning role in Alice Springs. Tim's academic qualifications and wide sports experience in coaching, teaching and administration have paid immediate dividends in his WRFL role. He successfully managed our junior interleague program comprising eight representative squads ranging from Under 12 to Under 18. He fills a key management role in our junior football program, as Secretary to the Juniors Board and with overall responsibility for administration of programs and competitions for 175 junior teams. Tim will be at the forefront of our projected growth in junior numbers, as new clubs are formed to meet the burgeoning population growth in the western region of Melbourne.

Cam Nation joined the staff team in a part-time role as Media & Communications Officer in February. A qualified journalist and highly successful swimming coach, Cam took on the challenge of "changing the face" of the WRFL. In his first few weeks on the job, he completely redesigned our website, creating an exciting and ever-changing on-line presence for our clubs and players. In the six short months since launching the new site, more than 70,000 absolute unique visitors have recorded over 700,000 page views, with visits totalling more than 25,000 every week across the football season.

Cam was also charged with the task of publishing a weekly Footy Record, following a period of seven years since the last issue in August 2003. Again, the result was most impressive with 1,500 high-quality copies distributed through clubs every week of the home & away season; and dozens more via post and email to WRFL Life Members, sponsors and local Council personnel. As the youngest member of the staff team, we look forward to Cam's ongoing and evolving role in presenting a friendly and professional image of the WRFL to the wider community; and in further developing our communication processes in all aspects of our operations.

Tracey Lawson was appointed in March as part-time Administration Officer, with key responsibility for administration of umpires' payroll. Tracey resigned in September to take-up an attractive offer of employment in the education sector. In her short time with us, Tracey worked with accountant Kim Peak to develop the detailed systems required to administer the registration of and payment to more than 270 umpires and support personnel. Tracey was popular with staff and umpires alike. Her replacement will benefit from the foundations laid by Tracey over the 2011 football season.

Since joining the staff team as Customer Service & Events Coordinator late in the 2010 season, Lyn McLeod has quickly won the respect and friendship of club officials, sponsors, Life Members, suppliers and everyone else who deals through our office. As the first point of contact for visitors and callers, Lyn plays a vital role in projecting the image of the League as a friendly and professional organisation with a clear philosophy of service to its member clubs. Lyn is responsible for the planning and delivery of functions such as the season launch, junior and senior presentations, and grand final luncheons.

General Manager of Football Operations David Newton is the longest-serving member of staff with five WRFL football seasons now under his belt. David's knowledge of complex player and club registration and transfer regulations and administration systems and his attention to detail are vital to our core business of managing a successful community football league.

The core staff team is supported in key areas by expert consultants.

Kevin Hillier served for many years in the consultancy role of Media Manager. Kevin continues as our Broadcast Consultant, coordinating a small volunteer team to deliver preview and match-day radio coverage through 88.9 WYN FM; and a series of web TV productions throughout the football Season. Kevin is also a familiar face as Master of Ceremonies of many of our functions.

Peter Harley has played a key role over the past twelve months in building a strong and sustainable base of corporate and sponsorship support. Income generated through Peter's efforts has already paid dividends through budgeted reductions in club affiliation fees. Further significant increases are forecast in this important source of non-club revenue under Peter's guidance.

Kim Peak has provided professional accounting services and systems development over the past two seasons. Kim's efforts have resulted in vastly improved information flow to both member clubs and suppliers; and in timely delivery of management reports to the Executive Board. She has also contributed to the development of umpire administration and payroll systems.

My personal thanks to our entire staff team and specialist consultants for all of your efforts, support and outstanding achievements over the past year.

The success of both our junior and senior finals series this year resulted from careful planning; and from access to the best available venues.

Wyndham City Council and Werribee Football Club provided great cooperation and assistance in making Avalon Airport Oval available for the bulk of our senior finals program. Our sincere thanks to Maurice Stabb and Ken Chalmers (Wyndham

City Council) and to Mark Penaluna (Werribee FC) for their help in making this possible.

The success of the junior finals series was in large part due to the use of 2-ground venues. Old Westbourne Football Club played host to the full four-week program, supported by Crofts Reserve (Altona North) and Grant Reserve (Altona). Laverton Football Club also hosted games in the first week of finals. The excellent facilities for players and families at Westbourne Grammar set the bench-mark for future finals hosting. We thank all of the clubs who worked so hard to host a great 2011 junior finals program.

Sponsorship is vital to the viability of all community football leagues and there is scope for further significant increase in that revenue source to the Western Region Football League. We will work hard to improve the returns to both our existing sponsors and the new ones that we will need to attract in order to meet budget targets. On behalf of the Executive Board and all WRFL clubs, I express our sincere thanks and appreciation to the loyal band of sponsoring partners who have supported the League financially in 2011. Football Operations

Season 2011 was earmarked as a year of development for the Western Region Football League, as the league set out to improve on many areas across the football competitions. The Division Two competition moved to eleven teams with the inclusion of Caroline Springs who entered its first senior teams since inaugurating with a junior side in 2003. This was highlighted with a win in Round One for both their seniors and reserves. In total team numbers remained the same as 2010 with 235 teams participating across 20 competitions.

After identifying many challenges associated with the structure of the junior competition the WRFL re-established the Juniors Board to assist the administration with strategic direction with the juniors. This led to single year age groups being implemented with two Under-13 and one Under-15 division complimenting the existing junior age groups. The Juniors Board along with the administration will continue to work hard on the foundations set in Season 2011 to enhance the experience of all junior participants. This year also saw the exciting implementation of a dedicated Under-12 girls competition. This was piloted over a six week competition with four teams and 60 participants enjoying our great game. We will be looking to all clubs to nominate teams for this competition in 2012.

One of the main points of the 2010 Strategic Plan was to address the 'evenness of competition', and therefore senior fixturing took a different direction in 2011. The priority was to match those teams who finished in similar positions the previous season against one another in the early part of the year. This in turn gave everyone an opportunity to be competitive and provide a base for the remainder of the year. This will be reviewed during the fixturing process for next year. Unfortunately we had some challenges with the

Under-18 fixtures this year due to the withdrawal of a number of teams on the eve of the season. The Under-18 competition is an integral part of the WRFL and clubs need to take responsibility in ensuring they provide a good pathway from juniors to seniors.

The WRFL was fortunate to have some great news stories from past and present WRFL players in 2011. Trent McKenzie (Williamstown Juniors/ Gold Coast) capped off a great debut season with national selection in the International Rules Series. Tom Liberatore (St Bernard's/ Western Bulldogs) won the Chris Grant medal for best first year player at the Bulldogs, while teammate Mitch Wallis (St Bernard's/ Western Bulldogs) enjoyed an excellent debut season. Majak Daw (Wyndhamvale/ North Melbourne) continued his development showcasing some incredible highlights while playing in the VFL while Bachar Houli (Spotswood/ Essendon/ Richmond) prospered with the move from Essendon to Richmond finishing fourth in the club's Best & Fairest. North Sunshine's Will Hoskin-Elliott shone for the Western Jets and Vic Metro earning himself selection in the U18 All Australian team and alongside the Williamstown Juniors' Elliott Kavanagh is expected to feature early in this year's national draft.

The focus on umpiring this year was to recruit and develop our young umpires to ensure we can appoint quality umpires to all WRFL fixtured matches. The academies at Mackillop College and Maribyrnong College continued to grow while we introduced a third academy at Caroline Springs College. Umpiring numbers have risen significantly in recent years so it is critical to provide quality coaching and a positive match day experience to allow the young umpires to prosper. Melanie Thompson-Allen and Stefan Bjelsovic were selected to officiate in the Australian School

Sports Championships in Canberra while some of our experienced umpires have been given the opportunity to trial at the VFL.

The WRFL football season culminated in an outstanding seven weeks of finals football. There was a total of fourteen junior competitions decided over the first four weeks, with finals played at Crofts Reserve, Altona, Laverton and Old Westbourne. Old Westbourne was the showcase venue of the junior finals hosting Grand Finals in front of record crowds who enjoyed some terrific football played in great conditions. All but three of our junior clubs had teams represented throughout the finals series. The senior finals were played at both Crofts Reserve and Avalon Airport Oval in Werribee where both the Division 1 and Division 2 Grand Finals were played.

Albion entered the Division One senior finals having only lost one game in 2011, being back in Round One in a Grand Final rematch against Spotswood. The Cats were hoping for back to back glory, and in extremely windy conditions they were able to proceed to the Grand Final defeating Spotswood by eight points in the Second Semi Final. Altona advanced to the Preliminary Final after kicking seven goals to Port Colts five in the last quarter of the First Semi Final with eleven points being the final margin. Most WRFL followers had Spotswood moving easily to the Grand Final after beating Altona by 96 points in the Qualifying Final. Altona however made a remarkable comeback taking Spotswood all the way to the final siren only to go down by the narrowest of margins being a solitary point in a remarkable Preliminary Final. Albion went into the Grand Final narrow favourites but missed critical opportunities in the first quarter kicking 2.8 to 0.1. From that point on Spotswood continued to gather momentum finally opening up a winning margin

kicking five goals to Albion's one in the last quarter to win by 45 points. It was Spotswood's fourth premiership in five years, and truly stamped the side as one of the best teams of the modern era. It had been forty-eight years since a Division One club had managed to win four premierships over a five year period, with the last club to do so being F&Y Socials back in 1963.

In the Division One reserves, Sunshine's finals series was movie script material with their first two finals matches heading to extra time before the Kangaroos won their last two finals matches by the same three point margin. The Grand Final will forever be remembered for the goal kicked from the boundary line after the siren by Sunshine Captain Andrew Thorn to win the game. Hoppers Crossing capped off a fantastic season defeating Altona by twelve points in the Division One Under-18 Grand Final that highlighted the fast paced and highly skilled competition.

The 2011 Division Two senior season was dominated by Deer Park who went through the home and away season undefeated with the closest margin being 35 points. They continued this form during the finals series defeating Albanvale by 129 points in the Qualifying Final and 131 points in the Grand Final. James Condos kicked seven goals with his last kick of the game being his 150th for the season. Wyndhamvale narrowly missed a Grand Final berth losing to Albanvale by three points in the Preliminary Final. It was a huge achievement for Wyndhamvale after finishing seventh in season 2010.

Parkside saw off all challenges during the Division Two reserves finals to defeat Coburg Districts by 29 points in the Grand Final. It was their second reserves Premiership in three seasons. The Division Two Under-18 Premiership was won by Point Cook who went through the year undefeated and beat Deer Park by 35 points in the Grand Final.

Overall the WRFL senior finals series was a great success with very good crowds witnessing some outstanding football. There was a large amount of planning and careful management of all finals venues which paved the way for a great result on and off the field. All host clubs, participating clubs, players and spectators are to be congratulated on putting on a great spectacle. We will continue to work extremely hard over the next six months to ensure the WRFL finals are played on the best possible grounds available to ensure the match day environment for all active and non active participants is an enjoyable to all.

I would like to take the opportunity to thank all clubs who are managed by dedicated and hard working committees and supported each week by a long list of volunteers. The professionalism shown by all clubs within the WRFL is testament to the quality match day experience on display.

The Football Operations team is appreciative of the support by various panels and individuals that ensure our league is continually improving as a community sporting organisation.

- Tribunal Chairman Dale Sayner and his committed panel of members that assist every week on the independent tribunal.

- Appeal Chairman John Doherty and appeals board who continue to assist often at short notice.
- Chairman Mark McDonald and the Independent Hearings Committee.
- WRFL Executive member Michael Psaila who was a great assistance with investigations throughout the season.
- Tribunal Secretary and Independent Timekeeper Brian Wilson who continues to do an outstanding job all year round.
- Finals match managers and gatekeepers who provided great assistance ensuring the finals were a success.
- Umpiring Manager Shane Carland and his team of coaches who have worked hard with the Umpiring Association in recent years to grow our umpiring numbers.

The WRFL administration has established a good team of dedicated staff. I would personally like to thank Bob Tregear, Tim Shellcot, Lyn McLeod, Cam Nation, Peter Harley, Kim Peak, Tracey Lawson and Andrew Muscat for their continued support and hard work throughout 2011.

Well done to all clubs on Season 2011 and I look forward to growing our great game in the West in 2012.

Club Development

Season 2011 presented many opportunities and challenges for the WRFL's staff and clubs, particularly with significant changes implemented in the junior competition. Twenty three of the WRFL's clubs fielded teams in the junior competition and, as a result of research completed and recommendations made in 2010, the junior competition moved to single year age groups. For the first time clubs had the opportunity to enter teams in U9, U10, U11, U12, U13, U14, U15 and U16 age groups, and while some problems existed in the early stages overall this re-structure has been well received and the change augers well for the future of junior football in the west. The goal for 2012 is to build on the foundation and knowledge 2011 has provided to present a competition in which all teams across all age groups have an opportunity to be competitive and enjoy their football.

As has become tradition the 2011 season for our U9 and U10 players culminated in the Junior Fun Day. North Footscray again hosted, with North Sunshine and Flemington Juniors stepping up to also host after it looked as though the day may have to be cancelled due to lack of suitable venues. Flemington Juniors in particular re-jigged the format, halving both of their grounds and playing four games at once. Play at JJ Holland Reserve was completed by midday, but at no expense of fun and enjoyment, and the feedback received on this format was very positive. Thanks to the three host clubs for their time and effort in providing the venues, match management and added extras such as barbeques, and to the players and parents who make the day a fantastic

finale to the U9 and U10 season. Recognition must also go to the WRFL Umpires Association, who provided junior umpires and umpire mentors. This had the dual benefit of enabling all matches to have official umpires while removing the need for club volunteers to umpire matches, allowing these volunteers greater freedom to enjoy the day.

Eight squads represented the WRFL in junior interleague matches in 2011. Our U12, U13, U16 and U18 squads played two matches each, while two U14 and two U15 squads competed in the AFL Victoria Metropolitan Championships. Congratulations go to our U12s and U13s for their success in the round robin day against the EDFL and RDFL, with both teams winning the carnival perpetual shield, the U12s for the first time since 2005 and the U13s for the first time in four years. Competing against some of the strongest junior leagues in metropolitan Melbourne, the U14 and U15 squads played a total of twelve matches in the Metropolitan Championships. Although the win/loss ratio may not have met the expectations of the players, each squad played entertaining and competitive football, and interleague experience for the U14 and U15 age groups is invaluable as they seek to develop their football. The U16s and U18s each played the RDFL and EDFL, with both squads defeating the RDFL but losing to the EDFL. The games against the RDFL were particularly competitive, with the U18s winning by two points and the U16s also winning by two points, but only after playing ten minutes of overtime following a draw.

The interleague program could not function

without the time and effort of the coaching staff, in particular the head coach of each squad; U12 – Cam Atkins, U13 – Tony Wright, U14 Div 1 – Gary Brennan, U14 Div 2 – Colin Clohesy, U15 Div 1 – Rod Lawson, U15 Div 2 – Jeff Stevens, U16 – John Radcliffe and U18 – Fab Gatti. Coaching an interleague squad is a difficult task requiring skills including talent identification, diplomacy and match day tactics and the competitiveness of all squads was a credit to each coach's ability to perform these different skills. A number of WRFL clubs hosted interleague training and/or matches, and thanks goes to Albanvale, Deer Park, Glenorden, Laverton, North Sunshine, Parkside, Yarraville Seddon and Western Jets football clubs for making their facilities available to assist in the development of the WRFL's best junior talent.

The junior finals series saw fourteen premierships decided, with eight different clubs achieving the ultimate goal of a premiership victory. From an operational perspective the series was a great success, with large crowds enjoying competitive football played in the proper spirit. This was helped by four weeks of good weather, allowing the players to display their skills to the best of their ability while providing spectators with a great environment in which to enjoy the show.

The Juniors Board, chaired by Keith Brown, continued to provide vital strategic advice to both WRFL administration and the Executive Board on the format, structure and functioning of the junior football competition. Comprised of WRFL club administrators, the Juniors Board made a number

of strong and measured recommendations in 2011. It is pleasing that when representing the Juniors Board each member is able to remove their 'club hat' and contribute to discussions and recommendations targeted at improving the league. The ability to assess what is the best action for the greater good cannot be underestimated and I congratulate each Juniors Board member for their work in 2011, and look forward to them again providing balanced and well thought out advice and direction for the junior competition in 2012.

The population in the western region of Melbourne continues to grow at an amazing rate, particularly in Wyndham City. This presents opportunities for the introduction of new clubs, particularly at a junior level, and for the development of existing WRFL clubs in the major population growth areas. The league will continue to work with all local government municipalities that are home to WRFL clubs to ensure that planning and infrastructure is in place to meet the needs of those wishing to play football, both in the immediate and long term future. While opportunities exist for the league to grow we must not neglect our traditional clubs in the inner west, including those who are currently struggling to maintain player numbers and teams in the junior competition. The league will continue to work with

these clubs and associated organisations such as AFL Victoria to create development plans to meet each club's needs.

As the junior competition continues to grow so does the need for parents and supporters to volunteer to undertake one (or many) of the various roles required to ensure our junior footballers continue to have the opportunity to enjoy the game of Australian Rules football. Regardless of whether that role is as a coach, administrator or canteen person it is a huge responsibility and commitment and it is a credit to our clubs and their volunteers that an excellent junior competition continues to be produced. It is also vital that junior clubs continue to build a positive culture and environment at their club to maximise the enjoyment and benefit players, parents and supporters obtain from their participation in junior football, and to make each club a welcoming place to all.

From my own perspective it was an interesting first season with the WRFL, especially after moving from a club based role in the VFL to league administration at community level. Thanks to WRFL staff Bob Tregear, David Newton, Lyn Mcleod, Cam Nation, Peter Harley, Kim Peak, Andrew Muscat and Tracey Lawson for their advice and assistance, and to the many club volunteers I met during 2011. It is clear that our

competition is filled with people who put in many unpaid hours of time and hard work to ensure their club (and therefore the league) is viable and sustainable and I look forward to continuing to work towards this goal with you all in 2012.

Umpiring continues to be a strongpoint of the Western Region Football League, with numbers throughout the season reaching an all-time high. Such significant participation ensured field umpire appointments for all senior fixtures, and field umpire appointments for approximately 80% of junior fixtures. In addition goal & boundary umpires were appointed to approximately 90% of games across both senior & junior competitions.

The success of these numbers is largely due to the work of our recruitment panel led by Terry O'Donnell, Mark Westgarth, Henry McFerran & Anthea Walshe. Their promotion of umpiring throughout local schools has seen our participation numbers increase to 250, including twenty female umpires. The recruitment of women in umpiring remains a major goal for the league, and we look forward to many more joining the ranks next season.

Our Umpiring Academies continue to produce talented junior umpires, with the launch of the Caroline Springs Academy, expansion of the Werribee Academy at McKillop College, and the continuation of the Maribyrnong Academy. The umpiring department would like to thank Mark Westgarth, Anthea Walshe & John Booker at McKillop College, Alf Galea & Phil Henderson at Caroline Springs, and Troy Pannel & Peter Dalgleish at Maribyrnong for their tireless work throughout season 2011, as well as Graham Hodgart & Peter Fitzgerald.

Another strength of the umpiring department this season was the invaluable contribution of our coaching staff, in particular Jamie Guppy, Peter Fitzgerald & Les Uldrich (Boundary), Graham Hodgart, David Wright, Leo Keating & John Manakis (Goal), Mark Mather, Dean Portelli, Paul Dimartino & Ross Walker (Field), and Terry McGarity (Fitness). The efforts of these personnel should not be underestimated as they continue to work hard to recruit & retain umpires while developing their skills and fostering a positive working environment.

The junior umpiring department was led admirably by Rene Van Kuyk & Mark Mather, with their organization of our large base of junior umpires culminating with a junior presentation night with over 150 in attendance.

The umpiring department would also like to recognize those who have assisted in 2011, in particular Maree Wilkie for her administrative support, the Trainers Association for assisting at umpire training, the mentors for their assistance with our junior umpires on Sunday mornings and who play a large part in the development and promotion of the umpires, and the families of each umpire for doing all those unnoticed things to ensure the best possible participation of our base of umpires. Your support is very much appreciated and without you the league would not be as strong.

The working relationship between the WRFL and the Umpiring Association could not be stronger, thanks to the tireless work of the association who continue to support our umpires and play a key role in the promotion & retention of our umpiring body.

Next season a number of challenges await as we aim to further promote & recruit as the league continues to expand. A standard has been set this season, with such a significant amount of games covered, and we need to continue this great record going forward. A gap still remains between the numbers of junior umpires, and those wanting to move up to a senior level, and we aim to continue to attract former players & retain existing umpires to ensure we have sufficient numbers at that very top senior level.

In closing I would like to thank all umpires on their performances throughout the year, with particular congratulations to Matt Harvey, Heath Grundy, Scott Vanstone (Field), Cameron Rycroft, James Scholes & Dominic Hoskins (Boundary), for being nominated to trial with the AFL. We wish them all the best knowing they will represent our league proudly. A sincere thanks to all umpires for their contribution to a very successful year, and we look forward to your continual involvement for many years to come.

Tribunal

The Tribunal continues to play an integral role in ensuring our game is played in the true spirit of Australian Rules football and that players and officials respect and abide by the expected standards of the WRFL.

Season 2011 saw a reduction of cases heard by the Tribunal in comparison to 2010. A total of 74 cases were directed to the Tribunal down from 88 last year but still significantly higher than the 46 experienced in 2009. Of the 74 cases a total of 89% were found guilty. There was little improvement in the number of serious cases, only down by three, however there was a reduction of behind the play incidents compared to previous seasons. Unfortunately this year saw an increase of serious charges relating to umpires with eleven cases being heard.

The Tribunal continued its hard line approach handing down significant penalties to those who seriously breach our rules by suspending players and officials up to two years in some instances. The Tribunal will continue to take this line to ensure the standards of behavior improve. Those who continually re-offend will be dealt with accordingly.

Again we were subjected to hearing a total of 30 junior cases with an increasing number from Under-14's and below. Although this number is excessive it must be noted that a much higher percentage of junior games were officiated by WRFL umpires in comparison to previous years. Nevertheless the number of offences is not acceptable, and clubs are reminded not to expect any leniency when junior players attending the

Tribunal are found guilty.

The Tribunal was disappointed in the number of officials being charged within the junior competition. This is something the WRFL will not tolerate and harsher penalties can be expected in 2012.

Again the WRFL Tribunal conducted a number of judicial advocate training, information and accreditation evenings. The feedback from those who attended was very positive and reflected when appearing before the Tribunal. Unfortunately it was very disappointing that some clubs neglected this opportunity. The Tribunal has given all clubs two years to have properly accredited advocates and if in season 2012 advocates are not accredited, they will not be permitted in hearings. The Tribunal will again provide a number of sessions prior to the 2012 season.

This year as with Season 2010 we had a small panel of Tribunal members. This however maintains a high level of consistency on verdict and penalty throughout the season.

Unfortunately there was only one Tuesday night throughout the entire season where the members of the panel did not sit.

A special thanks to the Deputy Chairman Adrian Noble who not only attended on 20 nights but whom also supported me with the advocate nights when held.

The hard work as tribunal secretary Brian Wilson does not go without notice or praise and I thank him for his ongoing support and commitment to the tribunal. Overall the co-operation put forward by all the clubs was of a high standard and in the best interest of fair play and sportsmanship.

Our aim as the Independent Tribunal is to minimise the work required on a Tuesday night.

The primary objective in the early part of the season was to redevelop our online presence, and to make the league's website a source of current & relevant information, while ensuring the promotion & exposure of the WRFL brand in the fast developing online world.

As well as a major aesthetic redesign, the new website encompassed a number of innovative new features including:

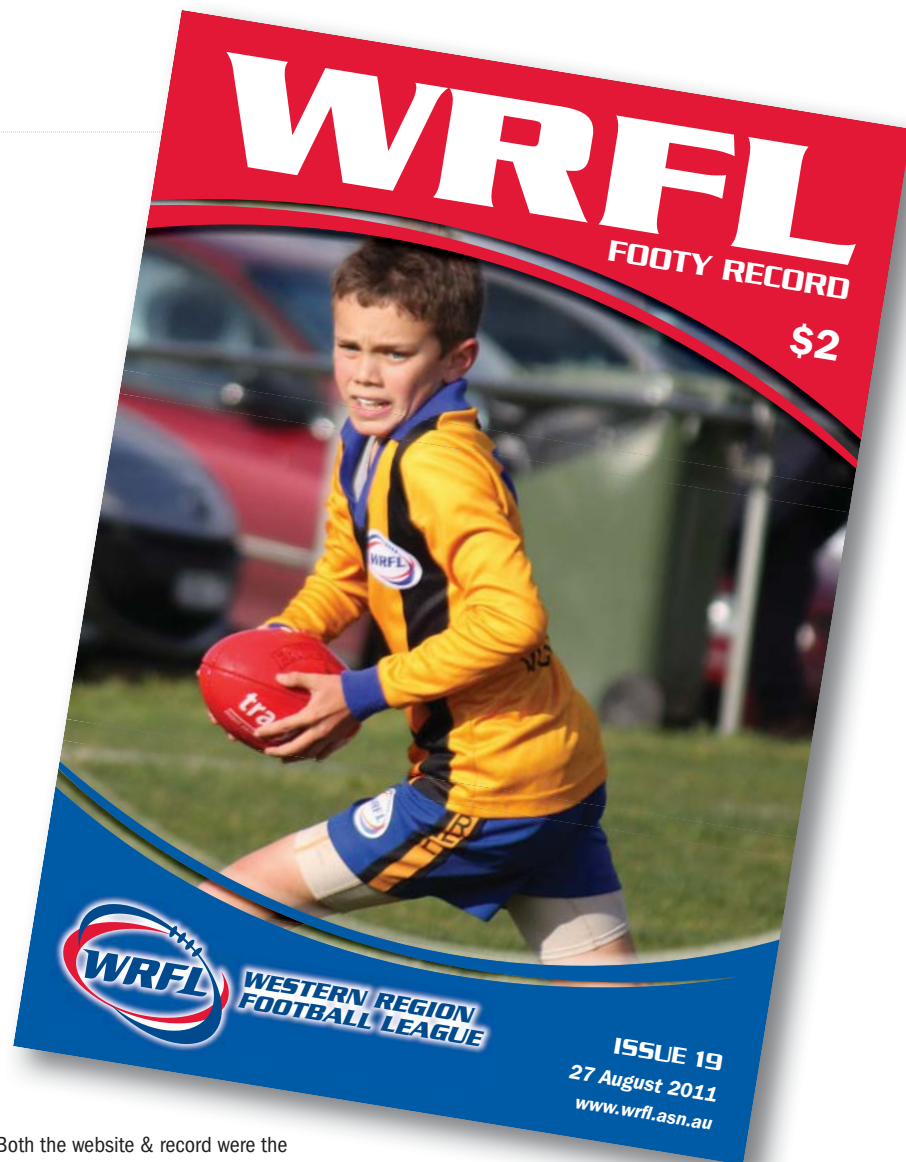
- A dedicated news stream

- Online versions of publications including the Footy Record

- A comprehensive statistical analysis page to track site usage

The launch of our Youtube, Picasa & Facebook pages added further online interaction with our membership base, with the Western Region Football League's website now one of the leading league sites across metropolitan Melbourne's in terms of both traffic & content.

The league's radio presence continued throughout season 2011 with the 'Friday Preview Show' and 'Saturday Match Of The Day' being broadcast on local radio & simulcast online. The team of Kevin Hillier, Adam Lux, Steve Thom, Andrew Muscat, Briony Ford & Matt Hellman ensured yet another successful season of WRFL broadcasting.

Finally the league has continued to further relationships with the local media outlets this season, with productive relations established with Star News Group, Leader Newspapers & Fairfax Weekly Publications. These positive relationships established throughout the season have ensured the league receives comprehensive & positive coverage across a wide-range of publications on a weekly basis, with several also allowing their material to be syndicated on the league website & throughout league publications.

Overall it has been a season of change for the league, with the adoption of a new media strategy and a more professional online & offline presence. NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2011

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

These financial statements are a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 1981, for use by the members of the League and to fulfil the board's requirements to prepare financial statements.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 and the following Accounting Standards:

AASB 101	Presentation of Financial Statements
AASB 107	Cash Flow Statements
AASB 108	Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors
AASB 110	Events after the Reporting Period

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied. The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations. The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis.

The following significant accounting policies have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements and consistently applied to all periods covered.

PROPERTY, PLANT & EQUIPMENT

Items of property, plant and equipment are carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment loss. Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the association and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other repairs and maintenance are charged to the income and expenditure statement during the financial period in which they are incurred.

Gains and losses on disposal of an item of property, plant & equipment are determined by comparing the proceeds from disposal with the carrying amount, and are recognised net within other income in the income and expenditure statement.

DEPRECIATION

Depreciation is calculated on the depreciable amount of all fixed assets over their useful lives commencing from time the asset is held ready for use.

The depreciation methods and rates used for each class of assets are as follows:

Office Equipment – Diminishing value method 15% to 20%

Motor Vehicles – Diminishing value method 18.75%

Computer Equipment – Diminishing value method 40%

Leasehold Improvements – Straight line over 3 lease terms (9 years)

Furniture & Fittings – Diminishing value method 7.5% to 20%

Depreciation methods, useful lives and residual values are reviewed at each financial year end and adjusted if appropriate.

LEASES

Operating leases do not transfer substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to ownership of an asset.

Payments made under an operating lease are recognised in the expenditure statement on a straight line basis over the term of the lease. The leased assets are not recognised in the balance sheet of the association.

INVENTORIES

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. The cost is based on the first in, first out principle and includes expenditure incurred in acquiring the inventories and other costs associated with bringing them to their existing location and condition. Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less the estimated selling expenses.

EMPLOYEE BENEFITS

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related on-costs.

INCOME TAX

The League has been granted an income tax exemption by the Australian Taxation Office.

GOODS AND SERVICES TAX

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense. Receivables and payables are stated with amount of GST included. The net amount of GST recoverable or payable to the Australian Taxation Office is included as a current asset or liability in the balance sheet.

REVENUE RECOGNITION

Property Division Sales

Property Division Sales represent revenue earned from the sale of products to member clubs. Revenue is recorded when the goods are despatched.

Interest Income

Interest Income is recognised as it accrues.

Management Fees

Management Fees represent revenue earned from charges to member clubs used to fund the provision of services (including but not limited to umpires).

Asset Sales

The profit or loss on disposal of assets is included as revenue of the association. Such profit or loss on disposal of assets is brought to account at the date an unconditional contract of sale is signed. During the period ended 31 October 2010 the League re-located its offices from Yarraville Oval to Whitten Oval which resulted in the write off of assets no longer used by the League. The loss from this write off is separately disclosed as an abnormal item in the income and expenditure statement.

COMPARATIVE AMOUNTS

It should be noted that in 2010 the League changed its year end date from 30 September to 31 October, to better account for the seasonal nature of the League's operations. As a result the comparative period amounts are representative of thirteen months and the current period amounts are for a period of twelve months. However, given the nature of the operations of the association being seasonal, it is not considered that the comparable nature of the comparatives has been compromised.

There have been some comparative figures that have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.

Rental is reviewed annually in May and is subject to a CPI increase. For the purposes of this note, a CPI increase each year of 3.5% has been assumed.
