FINALS FOOTY CONTINUES TO HEAT UP

This week the WRFL announced the winner of the 2017 SEN MVP award.

The prestigious award, voted by the Division 1 coaches, was awarded to Deer Park champion Chris Stewart.

Stewart has had an outstanding season with the Lions with six of the league's 10 division one coaches voting for him this year.

Last year's winner Tom Langlands came in second, just one vote behind Stewart. Altona's Steve Kennedy rounded out the top three.

This weekend Deer Park will take on Sunshine in the Division 1 Second Semi Final. The winner will go straight into the Grand Final.

If successful, it will be the Lions' fifth consecutive Grand Final appearance.

The Yarraville Seddon Eagles and Parkside Football Clubs already find themselves in their respective Grand Finals.

The Eagles will play either North Footscray or Manor Lakes in the Division 2 decider on September 10 at Burbank Oval.

The Magpies will go head-to-head with either the Wyndham Suns or Tarneit in the Grand Final on September 9 at Hogans Road Reserve.

Meanwhile, the WRFL has also opened up the nominations for the 2017 Melbourne Injury Lawyers Unsung Hero Award.

As a community we tend to focus on the results on the field, but as a league we believe it is important to honour the 'unsung heroes' of our great competition.

This award was created to recognise the people who unselfishly give up their time throughout the year to their club.

Volunteers often do their jobs without reward or credit, but are the heart and soul of the footy club. If you know a person deserving of this award, turn to page 6 for nomination details.

The WRFL also recently held its Junior Presentation Night. It was a wonderful night, with more than 600 parents, players, club officials, umpires and supporters coming together to celebrate the best juniors in our great competition.

As per WRFL By-Law 3.28, in the event of a draw in any of the final series of matches up to and including the Grand Final, the match shall continue under the rules of extra time until one team can be deemed the winner. At the completion of official time both goal umpires will confer and confirm to the field umpire the score is level. If this is confirmed both teams will change ends and play for five (5) minutes (no time on). After five (5) minutes (no time on), both teams will again change ends and play for five (5) minutes (no time on) at which time both goal umpires will confer again. During such extra play, Coaches are not permitted to address their players. This process (2 x 5 minutes) shall be continued until a winner can be declared.

CHRIS STEWART WINS WRFL
SEN MVP AWARD

Chris Stewart can add another trophy to his growing cabinet this week, with the Deer Park champion voted as the Western Region Football League Most Valuable Player for 2017.

The Lions stalwart who is in the hunt for a fifth straight premiership was voted the MVP for this season, capping off another exciting year at John McLeod Reserve.

Voted by the Division 1 coaches, Stewart polled 24 votes to claim the award.

He finished one vote ahead of last year’s winner, Spotswood’s Tom Langlands and four votes ahead of Altona’s Steve Kennedy who scored 20 votes.

Now in its seventh year the SEN Most Valuable Player Award recognises the WRFL’s best overall senior player in the Division 1 competition.

Using the 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 system, coaches voted for the players that were not necessarily the ‘best player,’ but one who embodies leadership, versatility, ability to play under pressure, skill and courage, respect for all umpires and overall value to their team.

A total of 24 players were nominated for the award. Stewart has had a stellar year at the Lions. Of the 18 games he has played, he was named in the best on eight occasions.

Six of the Division 1 coaches voted for Stewart, three of which gave him five votes.

“I am a bit in shock to be honest,” Stewart said.
“It is a privilege and an honour all rolled into one, it’s exciting.
“I have the utmost respect for the coaches in our

league and to be voted MVP is a privilege.”
Stewart said the reason why his game has stepped up another level this season was because he lost weight.
“I pulled my finger out and finally lost some weight,” he said. “My mates and my family have supported me along the way.

“I knew I had the talent it was a matter of being fit and getting my fitness up.”

Deer Park are now eyeing off a fifth consecutive Grand Final. Their first challenge is the Sunshine Football Club in the Second Semi Final on Saturday.

REGIONAL FACILITY PLANNING REAPS REWARDS

The Western Metropolitan Region is one of the fastest growing regions in Australia. Collectively the local government authorities within the Region are expected to grow by 198,000 people over the next 10 years to 2025.

The **Western Metropolitan Region Football Facilities Strategy** was completed in early 2016 in collaboration with the five LGAs in Melbourne's west of Hobsons Bay City Council, Melton City Council, Wyndham City Council, Maribyrnong City Council and Brimbank City Council.

The strategy involved analysis of the 64 football facilities operating in the region, future infrastructure demand to support the growth of football, and the establishment of clear objectives to guide future investment into community football facilities.

The strategy's vision is: ***To collaboratively plan football facilities that enhance the opportunity for participation, inclusion, access and sustainability across the western region community.***

In pleasing news for all involved in the Western Region Football League, recent analysis by the

partner local government authorities has shown that over \$40 million in facility development has been undertaken or committed to, across 33 separate projects, consistent with the strategy recommendations since the strategy was developed.

Projects range from a \$120,000 upgrade to lighting at Shorten Reserve in West Footscray, to a \$12 million upgrade to Chirnside Park in Werribee.

Venues have been upgraded to improve unisex changeroom provision, install lighting for improved fixturing flexibility, ground renovation to increase their carrying capacity along with a host of other projects. As participation in the game continues to grow, so does the need for facilities to support not only the growth, but the changing profile of participation. Increasing the capacity of grounds and pavilions and the development of unisex facilities that welcome participants and umpires from each gender has never been more important.

The WRFL and AFL Victoria wish to acknowledge and thank each of the partner local government authorities for their continued support of footy in this region. When you consider the above outcomes, there is little doubt that local government is our game's biggest supporter in this region.



JUNIOR WRFL STARS RECOGNISED

SOME of the WRFL's brightest young stars came together earlier this month as the league crowned its newest set of junior best and fairest winners.

More than 600 people gathered at the Encore Events Centre in Hoppers Crossing for the WRFL's annual junior presentation night.

Players and coaches were recognised with awards. The top five players in each division were presented with trophies, Interleague best players were recognised and premiership coaches and captains were also presented on stage.

North Melbourne duo Sam Durdin and Corey Wagner were the special guests. The talented young duo spoke about their pathways into the AFL and shared some advice to the junior players in the audience who also dream of playing in the AFL or AFLW competition.

One of the first awards handed out was the Junior Coach of the Year award, which was won by Sunshine Football Club's Raphael Kardachi.

The Youth Coach of the Year award was won by Altona's Under 17 coach John Szanyi. John's Vikings, claimed the premiership at the weekend, the team went through the 2017 season undefeated.

Attention then turned to the Junior Best and Fairest awards, our first winner was Sunshine Heights young gun Issah Kailie, he won the Under 11 Division 3 medal.

Jack Gerardi from the West Footscray Football Club won the Under 11 Division 2 best and fairest by one vote.

It was a three-way tie in the Under 11 Division 3 category, Mitchell Gardiner from Werribee Centrals, Harry Orr from Newport Power and Noah Tullio from Werribee Districts all won.

Caroline Springs star Benedict Abiyie and Werribee Centrals youngster Dakota Bajic, both finished on 18 votes to win the Under 12 Division 2 award.

Williamstown Juniors' Harry Schuurmans capped off his incredible season, winning the Under 12 Division 1 Best and Fairest award.

Kiera Whiley from Caroline Springs won the Under 12 Girls award, she finished three votes ahead of Sierra Grieves from the Yarraville Seddon Eagles.

Yusuf Kailie won his second straight best and fairest award, this year he won the Under 13 Division 3 award. The Sunshine Heights star was also a member of the Dragons' premiership winning team on the weekend.

Werribee Centrals' Mabek Atem won the Under 13 Division 2 best and fairest and Williamstown Juniors star Matthew Payne won the Under 13 Division 1 medal.

Wyndham Suns junior Navdeep Singh won the Under 14 Division 2 award. He was five votes clear of second place.

Bailey Moffatt, Under 14 Division 1 premiership captain from Point Cook, won the Under 14 Division 1 Best and Fairest medal.

Albion's Kyle Holden was the clear winner of the Under 15 Division 2 Best and Fairest. He finished on 24 votes, 12 ahead of second place.

Talented duo Eddie Ford and Nash Reynolds from the Yarraville Seddon Eagles and Werribee Districts Football Clubs won the Under 15 Division 1 medal. The pair both finished on 18 votes.

Dakodah Cott from Tarneit, playing in her first year of football, won the Under 15 Girls award.

Albion's Darcy McPherson won the Under 17 Division 2 best and fairest. He was six votes ahead of Elliot Tex Cucinotta.

Karan Bharathi from the Altona Junior Football Club won the Under 17 Division 1 award.

Wyndhamvale's young star Sharnie Whiting capped off her incredible season, she won the Under 18 Girls best and fairest. Three votes ahead of Point Cook's Emily Gardner.

Interleague best players were also recognised for their achievements during the Junior Metro Championships.

Jack Fletcher (Under 13A), Riley Evans (Under 13B), Jaelen Pavlidis (Under 14 Division 1), Aidan Williams (Under 14 Division 2), Ethan Mantas (Under 15 Division 1), James Callaway (Under 15 Division 2) and Isabelle Pritchard (Under 15 Girls) all claimed awards. WERRIBEE FC TO HOST SKILLS SESSION

Werribee Football Club is set to reaffirm its commitment to women's football in the Wyndham region with a free Women's Advanced Skills Session at Avalon Airport Oval on Monday, September 4.

AFL Women's stars Maddie Boyd (GWS Giants), Angelica Gogos (Western Bulldogs), Bree White (Collingwood), and Ashleigh Guest (Melbourne) will be on hand to assist with running the event, which has been created with the goal of fast-tracking skill development and game knowledge for local female players.

The evening will include tackling technique sessions with specialist coaches and a kicking program run by Kick 2 Advantage founder David Newett.

The initiative ties in with the club's ultimate ambition of fielding its own VFL Women's side next year, but Werribee community development manager Chris Gallagher said it also encompasses broader aims for the sport as a whole, particularly with regards to safety.

"A big part of it is about educating women on how to protect themselves within the game,"

Gallagher says of the session.

"Learning the correct techniques to protect your body in a contest takes time, and we are now seeing a lot of girls and women who are coming into football from non-contact sports who don't have that background and need some guidance.

"A lot of girls are bringing plenty of aggression to their game, which is great to see, but we want to make sure it is a controlled aggression to ensure their safety and the safety of their opponents."

The session kicks off at 6:30pm and is open to female players in the Wyndham region and surrounds from seniors down to Under 16s and to all coaches of local female teams.

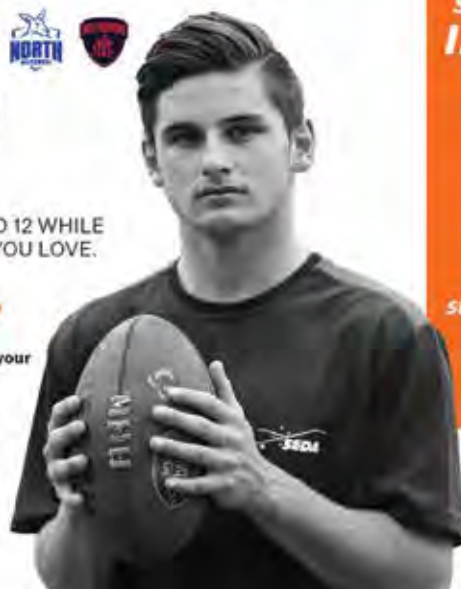

SUNSHINE SET FOR BLOCKBUSTER CLASH WITH DEER PARK

It picked up to such an extent in the final term, their first two kicks forward hoisted upwards and sailed backwards.

The Warriors kicked the first two goals of the final term through Jordan Mead and Brad Olsson, but as the breeze abated somewhat, Mark Pozzuto stormed into goal, giving his Tigers a glimmer of hope.

But a brilliant snap out of a pack by Ashlin Brown put Hoppers Crossing five points clear, and the Warriors held on to win by seven points, to continue their run at premiership redemption.

SIX GOAL QUARTER SEALS WARRIORS VICTORY

However it was one way traffic in the second-half, with Aaron Bradley's men kicking seven goals to three to win the match and progress through to Week 2 of Finals.

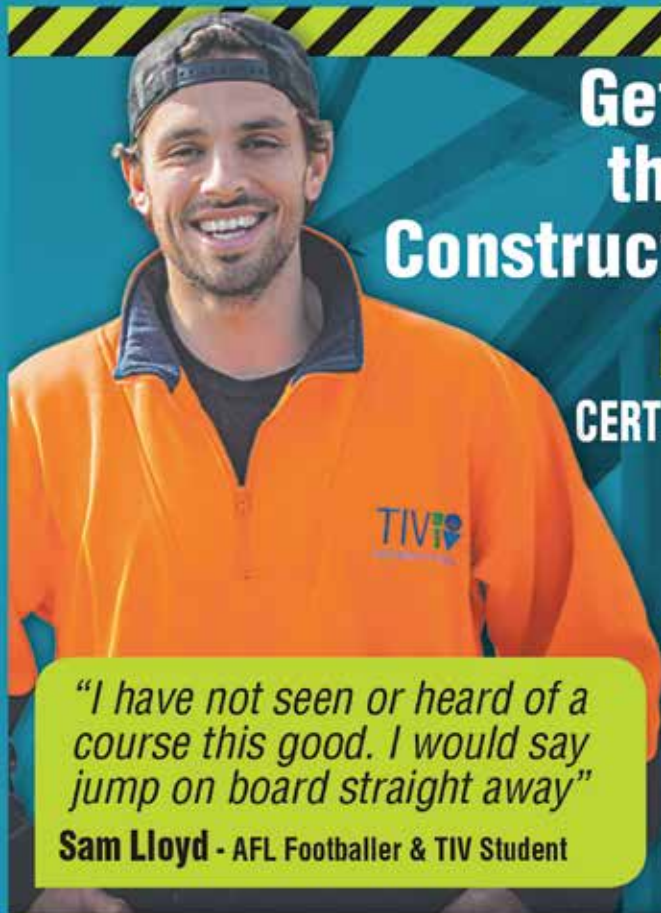
Jackson Redfern and James Farrugia each kicked three goals in the 48 point win. Redfern and William Finlay were named in the best for the Storm.

TEAMWORK THE KEY FOR UMPIRES

By **GRAEME HODGART**

Pre-season, mid-season and on the eve of the finals the message from Mark Westgarth has remained the same.

On quite a few occasions throughout this season he has been reminding everyone about the need for all umpires to work together. Although the duties and roles of field umpires, boundary umpires and goal umpires differ markedly, they need to work together in order for games to progress smoothly.

As for all teams within the WRFL, teamwork is a very important aspect. The local umpires work hard at officiating all games while displaying firm and precise teamwork between each other. It's all about teamwork.

It might be the case of one field umpire knowing exactly the right moment to hand over play to another field umpire. The boundary umpire may need to rely on the goal umpire to give an assist and indicate that the ball went out of bounds next to the behind post and didn't sneak in for a behind.

It may be the goal umpire giving a loud call of 'Mine' to alert both the field umpire and the boundary umpire that the ball just crossed the behind scoring line before being knocked back into the field of play. It's all about teamwork.

One aspect that the goal umpires have introduced this season is the Two Vees. In a bid to ensure that field umpires, in all grades, give a clear and precise 'All Clear' to the goal umpires after a score, the umpires are reminded about the Two Vees.

This stands for visual and verbal. To avoid any confusion, when there is a score, the field umpires are asked to give the All Clear by looking directly at the goal umpire, and while giving a hand signal, calling out All Clear loud enough for the goal umpire to hear. It's all about teamwork.

Mark Westgarth has also constantly reminded all umpires that during games, whether they are practice games, home-and-away matches or games in the junior finals or senior finals, they need to demonstrate control, composure and communicate effectively with each other. This also includes showing these attributes with players and officials.

Hopefully during the finals played this weekend you will be able to see positive example of umpires demonstrating control, showing composure in all circumstances and communicating effectively with each other and also with the players when called upon to do so.

QUIZ

In a senior WRFL final the siren goes to end the game and the goal umpires confirm that both teams have the same score. What happens next?

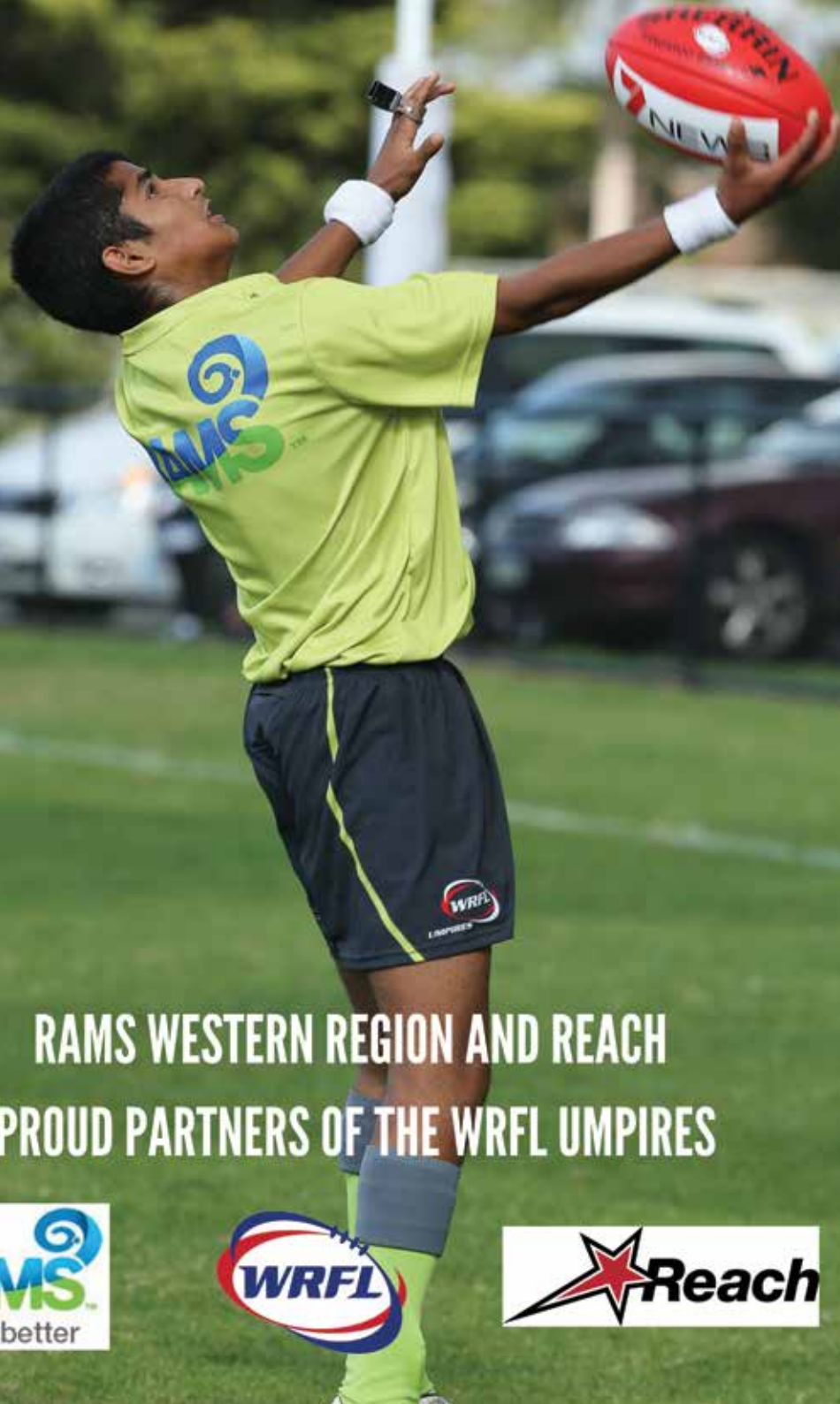
