EDITORIAL

Senior Final Series - Issue 4, September 22nd, 2018

After 2402 matches, the WRFL season all comes down to this! In the TIV Under 19's Grand Final, Altona meets Hoppers Crossing in a fitting match-up given the teams finished the home and away season in first and second place respectively. The two sides have met four times this season, with Hoppers



Crossing leading the ledger 3-1, including a comfortable win two weekends ago. Whilst the Under 19's only featured a handful of teams this year, the talent at the top-end has remained first-class, and this promises to be a Grand Final worth arriving early for.

In the RAMS Division 1 Reserves, Caroline Springs meets Altona, again the two benchmark teams across the home and away season. Having met three times this year, the final margin between the two teams has never exceeded 5 points, with today's game promising to provide more of the same. Caroline Springs will have enjoyed the week off and will bring with them strong support as always, whilst Altona secured their place in today's Grand Final with a 1-point win in a tough encounter with Deer Park last week. Only time will tell as to which is the better preparation for today's game.

In the RAMS Division 1 Grand Final, we're in for a great contest. This season only two wins separated first and fifth positions at the end of the home and away season, testament to just how closely matched the top five were this year. It made for a compelling home and away season, and an even more compelling RAMS Division 1 Finals Series.

For some, it might have appeared that Deer Park had come back to the pack this year. The club dropped four games during the home and season, its biggest number of losses in any one year since 2012, and indeed this was the first year since 2012 that the club didn't claim the minor premiership. But two dominant finals performances have served as an emphatic reminder that the finals-hardened Lions remain the ones to beat.

In contrast Hoppers Crossing have gritted their way through two tough finals, including back-to-back 3 point wins over Spotswood and last week Altona, in what was a dour struggle in tough conditions at Burbank Oval. The Warriors knocked over the Lions earlier in the year by 10 points on Deer Park's home deck, and will be looking to do the same again today to deliver the club's first senior flag since 2004. Whilst they face a formidable opponent, they should draw confidence from Sunshine's efforts on this day last year, where similarly the club went in as underdogs and very nearly took the chocolates.

Today's culmination to the 2018 season at arguably the western suburbs' premier football venue is set to capture the attention of the entire western suburbs football community. To that end I thank Werribee Football Club for hosting a significant portion of our finals series this year, including all three Grand Final days. It will come as no surprise to anyone that the Club has been a joy to work with and we look forward to our close partnership continuing long into the future.

I wish the best of luck to all teams competing today, and look forward to seeing you at the footy.

WARRIORS WIN, SET FOR LIONS SHOWDOWN

In pouring rain and what seemed like gale force winds, a spot in the RAMS Division 1 Grand Final was up for grabs. Despite finishing the regular season in first place, Altona were knocked out of the finals series, by a determined Hoppers Crossing team.

A goal late in the fourth quarter saw the Warriors overcome terrible weather to knock off the Vikings by three points and book their rematch with Deer Park, the two sides playing in the Premiership decider for the second time in three years.

Both sides kicked just three goals each as neither could manage the howling winds that turned the game into a battle for field position, mainly played out in front of the Williamstown stand wing.

Hoppers Crossing were on top for most of the day, but couldn't convert their strong play into a lead, recording nine behinds in the second quarter alone.

But it matters little as the Warriors kept fighting and scratching, not stopping until the late major that caused the upset of the finals series.

The 3.12. (30) to 3.9. (27) win will certainly not be remembered for the style it was played in, but it could be the confidence building win that spurs Hoppers Crossing into producing another upset in the Grand Final.

The loss ends Altona's season prematurely, given they finished the season on top of the ladder. While they were outplayed, it would be hard to find fault with the Vikings from Saturday's performance given how bad the conditions were and turned the match into a scrap.

Deer Park will enter the final as favourites on the back of their own form and the result of the last matchup between the two sides. The Lions were too good for the Warriors in their Qualifying Final, but if the weather is a factor as it was in the Preliminary Final, anything can happen.

As it currently stands, the forecast predicts rain and if that holds true, Hoppers Crossing will give themselves every chance to knock off the five-time reigning premiers.

The Lions showed their class in its two finals wins this season and if they can continue their great form they should create history and win their sixth flag in a row.



UMPIRES CORNER



HISTORY IN THE MAKING

History is in the making no matter who wins the grand finals today. The names of the participating teams and the scores will be entered into the WRFL history records for people to see for many years to come. The umpires who are officiating, out in the field, running the boundary lines or waving the flags from the goal squares, will also have their names recorded in the list of Grand Final Umpires.

Modern times have certainly changed things a little.

Today, there will be three field umpires, four boundary umpires and two goal umpires in the Division 1 Senior Grand Final. That's a total of nine on the field plus an emergency field umpire on the bench bringing the number up to 10!

Back in 1935, in the then Footscray District Football League, there were only five umpires in the A Grade Grand Final when West Footscray 12.12. (74) defeated Spotswood 10.8. (68). Robert Jones was the field umpire who also went on to do the next two A Grade Grand Finals making it three in a row.

There were only two boundary umpires in Walters and Keane and two goal umpires in Robins and Dickinson. These latter four were actually club umpires who, under a voting system conducted throughout the season, gained the most votes and were rewarded with the senior Grand Final.

Many years have passed since 1935, but thankfully the fundamentals of our great game are basically the same. The rules have seen some changes and many clubs with long forgotten names have come and gone.

During the 1930s, other than West Footscray and Spotswood, the FDFL also boasted some familiar teams in Seddon and Kingsville (now combined to form Yarraville Seddon Eagles), Braybrook, Altona, Parkside, ICI Deer Park and North Footscray Imperials.

Congratulations to all the clubs, teams, players, officials and umpires who are a part of this important historic day. For many, this is the culmination of a season of planning, training, meetings, many games, hard work and countless hours and a huge amount of effort.

Thank you to the WRFL, who have allowed this article to appear either online or in print in the Footy Record each week throughout 2018. This has allowed the umpiring fraternity to be seen and heard in a positive way by raising the profile of the umpires within the broad reaches of the WRFL.

Thanks also to the regular readers including a few who have given their own personal positive feedback at various times. It won't be too long before Season 2018 is done and dusted. Then we will all wait patiently in expectation for Season 2019!

QUIZ






