# WELCOME TO THE 2019 WORKSAFE AFL VICTORIA COMMUNITY CHAMPIONSHIPS

The WorkSafe AFL Victoria Community Championships returns in 2019, promising to deliver another exciting round of community football.

The 2019 WorkSafe AFL Victoria Community Championships is set to be bigger and better this year to deliver another thrilling round of football. The opportunity to participate in senior representative programs will again be a highlight for footballers in community competitions across Victoria.

A total of 30 leagues will compete in a one-off head-to-head match across different venues around the state, including Avalon Airport Oval and Mars Stadium. In addition, this year will see the introduction of 6 Senior Women's leagues competing in the 2019 WorkSafe AFL Victoria Community Championships.

The battle for community football's top ranking is set to be another blockbuster, when the Northern Football Netball League takes on Geelong Football League at Queens Park, Geelong. Big crowds are expected at the double header which also includes Bellarine Football League v Geelong District Football League. The Geelong Women's League will also play the Northern Women's League in a senior women's game on the same day.

AFL Outer East is set to play Bendigo this year for the first time as part of the newly expanded AFL Outer East initiative, which includes clubs who previously represented the South East Football Netball League. The Ellinbank District Football Netball League v West Gippsland Football Netball League match will be hotly contested as the two local rivals go head-to-head.

This year will also see games being played between Leagues who have not played one another in recent

history. These games include Goulburn Valley Football League v Western Region Football League, Hampden Football League v Ballarat Football Netball League, Bellarine Football League v Geelong District Football League, Sunraysia Football League v Heathcote District Football League and North Central Football League v Central Highlands Football League.

The WorkSafe AFL Victoria Community Championships are not only an opportunity for players, but also for umpires, coaches and volunteers to get involved in one of community footballs biggest events. We are proud to be able to showcase the best of community football to provide players with the opportunity to showcase their skills in front of big crowds.

Following on from another successful 2019 Community Umpiring Week earlier this month, I would like to congratulate all the umpires who have been selected to adjudicate in the 2019 WorkSafe AFL Victoria Community Championship matches.

Lastly, I would like to thank all the leagues, staff, players, coaches and volunteers involved in the 2019 WorkSafe AFL Victoria Community Championships for their passion and support in the lead up to the event.



## **MATCH DAY INFORMATION**

### Start Times

Under 18's: 10.15amSeniors: 12.15pm

### **Duration of Matches**

Seniors and Under 18's will run 4 x 20-minute guarters with time on.

### **Drawn Matches**

There shall be no drawn matches.

In the event of scores being level at the elapsed time the timekeepers are instructed to sound the siren. The field umpires will instruct both captains that the match shall recommence with the teams kicking to the same end as in the final quarter and that two five minute periods with time on shall be played with teams changing ends after the first five minute period immediately the siren sounds.

In the event of scores being level after the two five minute periods the timekeepers are to be instructed to keep the second period of extra time continuing until the next score.

Coaches are not permitted to address players at any stage after the three quarter time interval


